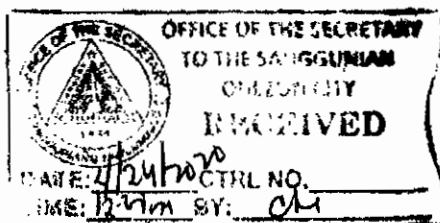

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. _____, S-2020

An Ordinance Granting Hazard Pay to Quezon City Government Personnel Who Physically Report for Work During the Period of Implementation of Enhanced Community Quarantine Relative to the COVID-19 Outbreak.

Introduced by Councilor Peachy V. De Leon, Franz S. Pumaren, and Donato "Donny" C. Matias

WHEREAS, on 8 March 2020 President Rodrigo Roa Duterte issued Proclamation No. 922 "Declaring a State of Public Health Emergency Throughout the Philippines" because of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic;

WHEREAS, on 11 March 2020, the World Health Organization characterized the COVID-19 outbreak as a global pandemic;

WHEREAS, on 12 March 2020, The President approved Resolution No. 11, series of 2020 of the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Disease, which imposed a community quarantine over the Metro Manila, and other health measures in Metro Manila and the Philippines;

WHEREAS, on 13 March 2020, the Quezon City Council, in a special session adopted Resolution No. 8141 series of 2020, which declared Quezon City under a state of calamity due to the pandemic;

WHEREAS, on 13 March 2020, the Executive Secretary issued a Memorandum requiring the restriction of non-essential movement within Metro Manila during the community quarantine period;

WHEREAS, on 16 March 2020, the President issued Proclamation No. 929 "Declaring a State of Calamity Throughout the Philippines due to Corona Virus Disease 2019" imposing an Enhanced Community Quarantine throughout Luzon.

WHEREAS, on 23 March 2020, the President issued Administrative Order No. 26 "Authorizing the Grant of Hazard Pay to Government Personnel who Physically Report for Work During the Period of Implementation of an Enhanced Community Quarantine Relative to the COVID-19 Outbreak";

WHEREAS, on 24 March 2020, the Department of Budget and Management issued Budget Circular 2020-1, on the subject: "Guidelines on the Grant of COVID-19 Hazard Pay";

WHEREAS, recognizing the risks that Quezon City Government personnel face during the public health emergency and Quezon City's state of calamity, the Quezon City Government shall grant COVID-19 Hazard Pay for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION DULY ASSEMBLED, THAT:

SECTION 1. *Grant of COVID-19 Hazard Pay.* This Ordinance provides for the grant of COVID-19 Hazard Pay to personnel who physically report for work during the implementation of Enhanced Community Quarantine in an amount not exceeding Five Hundred Pesos (PHP500) per day per person, which shall be computed as follows:

COVID-19 Hazard Pay = PHP500 x Number of days physically reporting for work during the quarantine period

Subject to:

- a. The Personnel Services limitation in Local Government Unit budgets under Republic Act No. 7160 in the case of regular personnel, and available Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses allotment in the case of Contract of Service (COS)/Job Order (JO) workers; and
- b. The conditions set in Section 2.

SECTION 2. *Covered personnel:*

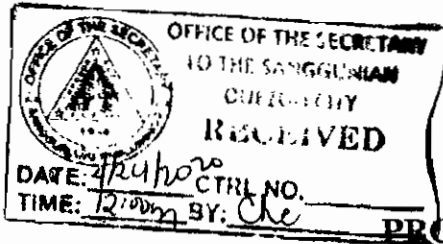
- a. The personnel are occupying regular, contractual or casual positions, or are engaged through COS, JO or other similar schemes;
- b. The personnel have been authorized to physically report for work at their respective offices or work stations on the prescribed official working hours by the Mayor and Head of Department, Office or Operating Unit during the implementation of the Enhanced Community Quarantine measures;
- c. The rate of COVID-19 Hazard Pay shall be based on the number of days an employee shall physically report for work using the formula in Section 1;
- d. Personnel who are already entitled to Hazard Pay, Hazardous Duty Pay, Hazard Allowance or other similar benefits under existing laws, issuance, rules and regulations, such as public health workers, public social workers, science and technology personnel, shall continue to be entitled to such benefits or the COVID-19 Hazard Pay, whichever is higher.

SECTION 3. *Retroactive Application.* The grant of COVID-19 Hazard Pay shall be effective beginning 17 March 2020.

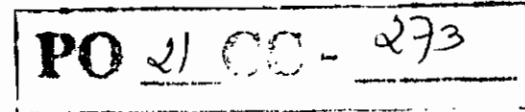
SECTION 4. *Source of Funding.* The COVID-19 Hazard Pay shall be taken from the appropriation of Fiscal Year 2020 Local Government funds.

SECTION 5. *Automatic Dissolution* – This Ordinance shall be deemed automatically dissolved and without effect immediately after the State of Public Health Emergency due to Covid-19 has been lifted by proper authorities.

SECTION 6. *Effectivity.* This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.



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PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. _____, S-2020

An Ordinance Granting of Special Risk Allowance to Frontline Quezon City Public Health Workers During the Period of Enhanced Community Quarantine Relative to the COVID-19 Outbreak.

Introduced by Councilor Diorella Maria G. Sotto-Antonio, Franz S. Pumaren, and Donato "Donny" C. Matias

WHEREAS, on 8 March 2020 President Rodrigo Roa Duterte issued Proclamation No. 922 "Declaring a State of Public Health Emergency Throughout the Philippines" because of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic;

WHEREAS, on 11 March 2020, the World Health Organization characterized the COVID-19 outbreak as a global pandemic;

WHEREAS, on 13 March 2020, the Quezon City Council, in a special session adopted Resolution No. 8141 series of 2020, which declared Quezon City under a state of calamity due to the pandemic;

WHEREAS, on 16 March 2020, the President issued Proclamation No. 929 "Declaring a State of Calamity Throughout the Philippines due to Corona Virus Disease 2019" imposing an Enhanced Community Quarantine throughout Luzon;

WHEREAS, on 6 April 2020, the President issued Administrative Order No. 28 "Authorizing the Grant of Special Risk Allowance to Frontline Public Health Workers During the Period of Enhanced Community Quarantine Relative to the COVID-19 Outbreak"; and

WHEREAS, on 7 April 2020, the Department of Budget and Management issued Budget Circular No. 2020-2, on the subject: "Guidelines on the Grant of Special Risk Allowance to Frontline Public Health Workers During the Period of Enhanced Community Quarantine Relative to the COVID-19 Outbreak";

WHEREAS, in accordance with Republic Act (RA) No. 11469 or the "Bayanihan to Heal as One Act" which vested the President, as a temporary measure, the authority to provide COVID-19 SRA to all PHWs, in addition to the Hazard Pay under RA No. 7305 or the "Magna Carta of Public Health Workers"; and

WHEREAS, recognizing the risks front line Quezon City Government public health workers are facing during the public health emergency and Quezon City's state of calamity, the Quezon City Government shall grant a one-time Special Risk Allowance for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION DULY ASSEMBLED, THAT:

SECTION 1. *Definition of Quezon City Public Health Worker (QCPHW).*

Shall refer to Quezon City Government (QCG) paid medical, allied medical, and other necessary personnel assigned in Quezon City hospitals and healthcare

facilities and who are directly catering to or in contact with COVID-19 patients, persons under investigation or persons under monitoring.

SECTION 2. *Coverage.* This Ordinance shall only cover QCG paid QCPHWs for the COVID-19 Special Risk Allowance subject to the conditions below.

SECTION 3. *Grant of COVID-19 Special Risk Allowance (SRA).* This Ordinance grants a one-time COVID-19 SRA equivalent to twenty five percent (25%) of monthly basic salary/pay to QCG paid QCPHWs who have great exposure to health risks and physical hardships in the line of duty, in light of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The payment of the COVID-19 SRA is subject to the Personnel Services (PS) limitations under RA No. 7160, in the case of regular/contractual/casual personnel of the Local Government Unit and available Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses allotments in the case of contract of service (COS)/job order (JO) workers.

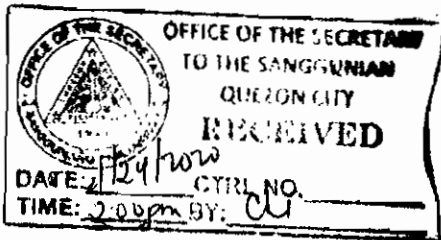
SECTION 4. *Conditions on the Grant of the COVID-19 SRA.* The one-time COVID-19 SRA shall be granted subject to the following conditions:

- a. The QCPHWs provide critical and urgent services to respond to the public health emergency during the implementation of the Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ);
- b. The QCPHWs are either: (i) civilian employees occupying regular, contractual, casual or part-time positions; or (ii) workers engaged through COS or JO, provided that the said COS/JO workers are assigned to Quezon City hospitals and other healthcare facilities;
- c. The QCPHWs physically report for work at their assigned work stations on the prescribed official working hours, as authorized by the Mayor and Head of Department, Office or Operating Unit during the period of the implementation of ECQ; and
- d. The grant of the COVID-19 SRA shall be pro-rated based on the number of days that the QCPHWs physically report for work during the period of ECQ in their respective places of assignment, reckoned not earlier than 17 March 2020, as follows:

Number of Days Physically Reporting for Work	Percentage of the Incentive
3 to 7	25%
8 to 12	50%
13 to 17	75%
18 or more	100%

SECTION 5. *Exclusion from the Grant of the COVID-19 SRA.* Those engaged without employer-employee relationship and funded from non-Personnel Services appropriations/budgets, except as authorized under Section 4 of this Ordinance, are excluded from the grant of the COVID-19 SRA, such as, but not limited to the following:

- a. Consultants and experts engaged for a limited period to perform specific activities or services with expected outputs;

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET NUMBER 2, GENERAL FUND FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020 IN THE AMOUNT OF FOUR HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE MILLION ONE HUNDRED TWENTY THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE PESOS (PHP 479,120,265.00) REPRESENTING THE 13TH MONTH IRA DOWNLOADED BY THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT PURSUANT TO RA 11469 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE BAYANIHAN HEAL AS ONE ACT TO FUND VARIOUS MAINTENANCE AND OTHER OPERATING EXPENSES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, on 13 April 2020, Ordinance No. SP- 2909, Series of 2020 was approved providing for a Supplemental Budget No. 1 in the amount of Two Billion and Eight Hundred Million Pesos (Php 2, 800,000,000.00), in response to Covid-19 pandemic and for other operational expense;

WHEREAS, Section 4 of Republic Act No. 11469 (the Bayanihan to Heal as One Act) granted the President the power to adopt various temporary emergency measures to respond to crisis brought by Covid-19 pandemic;

WHEREAS, on 07 April 2020, the Department of Budget and Management has issued Local Budget Circular No. 125, prescribing guidelines and procedures on the release and utilization of the Bayanihan Grant to Cities and Municipalities (BGCM), which is equivalent to the one-month FY 2020 Internal Revenue Allotment share of the cities and municipalities;

WHEREAS, on 17 April 2020, the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) has released in favor of the City Government an amount of Four Hundred Seventy-Nine Million One Hundred Twenty Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Five Pesos (PHP 479,120,265.00), in relation to RA No. 11469 and Local Budget Circular No. 125 to aid the City in its response to mitigate the spread of Covid-19 and its impact to the community;

WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of the Finance Committee, duly certified by the City Treasurer, that the said funds are actually available and there is a need to appropriate the aforementioned BGCM, in the amount of Four Hundred Seventy-Nine Million One Hundred Twenty Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Five Pesos (PHP 479,120,265.00) to fund various Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses of the City Government to further respond to Covid-19 pandemic.

NOW, THEREFORE,

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN
REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:**

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - The amount of Four Hundred Seventy-Nine Million One Hundred Twenty Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Five Pesos (PHP 479,120,265.00) is hereby declared as Supplemental Budget No. 2 to be defrayed for the following expenditures:

Introduced by Councilor JORGE L. BANAL, SR.,

WHEREAS, Section 34 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that local government units shall promote the establishment and operations of non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and peoples organizations (Pos) to become partners in the pursuit of local economy;

WHEREAS, Article 64 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of the said Code provides that the local sanggunian concerned shall accredit the NGOs and Pos based within its jurisdiction subject to the criteria and procedures for membership set-forth by the local special bodies;

WHEREAS, relative to the said Code and its IRR, Ordinance No. SP-23, S-92 was enacted creating the NGO and PO Accreditation Committee to process the applications for accreditation of NGOs and POs;

WHEREAS, these three hundred seventy four (374) NGOs and POs have applied for accreditation with the Quezon City Council, through the Barangay and Community Relations Department (BCRD);

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. The three hundred seventy four Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), People's Organizations (POs) and other Civil Society Organizations are hereby accredited pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR), in relation to DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2019-72.

SECTION 2. The three hundred seventy four accredited organizations shall inform, within thirty (30) days from the approval of this Ordinance, the Quezon City Council, through the Office of the Secretary to the Sangguniang Panglungsod (OSSP), copy furnished the Barangay and Community Relations Department (BCRD), of any major changes in their organization, particularly within respect to their officers and office address.


SECTION 3. The Quezon City Government, through the OSSP and in coordination with the BCRD, shall prepare and issue Certificate of Accreditation to the herein accredited organizations, duly signed by the City Mayor, the City Vice Mayor and the Chairperson of the NGO and PO Accreditation Committee and attested by the Secretary to the Sanggunian.

Section 4. The Official List of the said three hundred seventy four organizations shall form an integral part of this Ordinance.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.

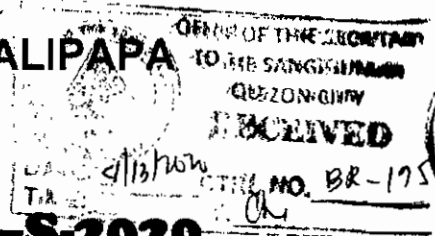

3. The number of persons inside or within the establishment shall be limited to one (1) person per one square meter (1sqm.) per open floor, most especially at the supermarkets, grocery stores, drugstores, pharmacies, convenience stores, commercial banks, bayad centers, and personal services;
4. Regular cleaning and disinfection within the premises of the establishment shall be regularly conducted; and
5. Any kind of non-essential social functions or gatherings shall be strictly prohibited.

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER ORGANIZING THE BARANGAY HEALTH EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (BHERT)

WHEREAS, Section 15 Article 2 of the 1987 Constitution and Section 16 or the General Welfare Clause of the Local Government Code provide that the local government units are charged with the promotion of health and safety of their constituents at the local level;

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the Department of the Interior and Local Government issued Memorandum Circular 2020-018 providing for Guides to Action Against "Corona Virus" to all local government units;

WHEREAS, DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2020 -018 enjoins all local government units to organize and mobilize the Barangay Health Emergency Response Team (BHERT) in all barangays nationwide to help manage coronavirus suspects and their contacts;

NOW, THEREFORE, I **Atty. Eric R. Juan** Punong Barangay of Barangay Talipapa, Quezon City, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law do hereby organize the Barangay Health Emergency Response Team (BHERT) as follows:

Section 1. Composition. The Barangay Health Emergency Response Team (BHERT) is hereby organized to be constituted as follows:

Section 2. Functions. The Barangay Health Emergency Response Team (BHERT) shall exercise the following functions:

- a. With or without the list of arrivals from the Mayor supposed to be given by the Bureau of Immigration (BI), conduct visits in the home of every arriving person from a Coronavirus affected country;
- b. Immediately list down the person(s) the arriving residents(s) came in contact with prior to his/her arrival in his/her residence;
- c. Require the arriving residents(s) to check and record temperature daily, in the morning and in the afternoon, for the duration of the 14-day house confinement period. Advise the arriving residents(s) to watch out for any other symptoms of Coronavirus like cough, difficulty in breathing or shortness of breath;

- d. Check on the condition of the arriving residents(s) daily from a distance of more than one (1) meter. In checking, always wear N95 or surgical mask;
- e. If symptoms are observed, Immediately isolate and confine the arriving resident, now a Coronavirus suspect, to a room away from the members of the household prior to his/her immediate transport to a DOH-designated Coronavirus-referral center or hospital for further examination and treatment. Require the Coronavirus suspect to wear N95 or surgical mask. Place the rest of the household also under 14-day home confinement. Repeat the process for them, including contact tracing. If no signs manifest, report to the City or Municipal Health Officer for lifting the home confinement.
- f. In no symptoms are observed after the 14-day home confinement, report the matter to the City or Municipal Health Officer for lifting of home confinement; and
- g. Report to the Punong Barangay on measures or actions taken per arriving resident.

Section 3. Funding Support. Funding support for the Barangay Health Emergency Response Team (BHERT) shall be charged against the available fund of the barangay subject to existing laws, rules and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER DIRECTING THE STRICT IMPLEMENTATION OF SPECIFIC GUIDELINES OF THE BARANGAY TALIPAPA, QUEZON CITY, IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE RECOMMENDATIONS AND ORDERS OF THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT AND QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19) SITUATION

The Barangay Talipapa People Civic Center shall continue to operate for the delivery of basic services such as the Administrative Office for issuance of barangay clearances and the Complaints Desk to receive reports and complaints and/or to provide immediate response thereto, without prejudice to implementation of flexible work arrangements for the barangay employees, if deemed necessary. Provided, that all residents and non-residents who shall be transacting within the Barangay Talipapa People Civic Center are ordered to wear their FACE MASK, use ALCOHOL provided in the premises, and undergo THERMAL SCAN, if available, before entering the area. Provided, further, that all are encouraged to call our Barangay Hotlines and/or visit our mobile posts for your concerns;

2. All activities, meetings, seminars, gatherings, events, programs, and other similar happenings shall be temporarily PROHIBITED until further notice as a means of social distancing. In this view, all residents, business establishments owners, organizations and associations, including HOA, neighbourhood, NGO's, and PO's, are urged and encouraged to cancel and/or postpone their initiated events and activities. In such event that an activity may no longer be cancelled due to justifiable and special reasons, please inform and coordinate the same to our Barangay for determination;

3. All PUBLIC OPEN SPACES (basketball/ volleyball/ tennis/ covered or open courts, multi-purpose halls, parks, and playgrounds) and other public places owned by the Government under the control and management of the Barangay shall be TEMPORARILY CLOSED until further notice. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately and all prior Executive Order that are inconsistent herewith are abrogated or amended accordingly.



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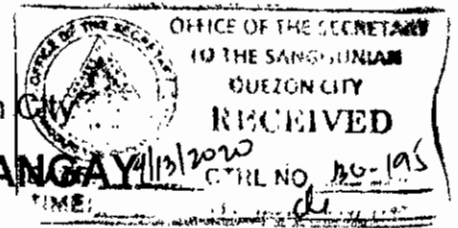

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER DIRECTING ALL BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS OPERATING WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF BARANGAY TALIPAPA, DISTRICT VI, QUEZON CITY TO STRICTLY OBSERVE THE HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES RECOMMENDED AND ORDERED BY THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT AND THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT PERTAINING TO THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) SITUATION AND PROVIDING SPECIFIC PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES IN COMPLIANCE THEREWITH

WHEREAS, Section 15 of Article II of the 1987 Constitution provides that the State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them;

WHEREAS, on 7 January 2020, it was reported that the cause of a viral pneumonia outbreak in the Wuhan, China was a novel type of coronavirus that has not been previously identified in humans;

WHEREAS, on 30 January 2020, the World Health Organization has considered the said disease as Public Health Emergency and on the same date, the Department of Health (DOH) confirmed the first COVID-19 case in our country;

WHEREAS, on 8 March 2020, President Rodrigo R. Duterte, through Proclamation No. 922, declared a State of Public Health Emergency, recognizing that the COVID-19 public health event constitutes a threat to the national security;

WHEREAS, likewise, in view of the said Resolution, safety measures were ordered by President Rodrigo Duterte during his State of the Nation Address (SONA) on COVID-19, such as extended suspension of classes until April 12, 2020, prohibition of mass gatherings during the said period, community quarantine within the entire Metro Manila, flexible work arrangements, etc.;

WHEREAS, following the proclamation of President Rodrigo R. Duterte and the recommendations of the ITAF-EID, more particularly the imposition of wide-ranging emergency health and safety measures, the Quezon City Mayor Josefina G. Belmonte-Alimurung issued Executive Order No. 19 entitled, "Emergency Measures Against COVID-19", dated 13 March 2020;

WHEREAS, in strict compliance with the directives and proclamations of the National and the Quezon City Government on the prevention of the spread of COVID-19 not only throughout our city but the entire country, the Barangay Talipapa deems it necessary to impose the necessary precautionary measures to all business establishments within its territorial jurisdiction;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Punong Barangay of Barangay Talipapa, District 6, Quezon City, I do hereby all business establishments operating within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Talipapa, District VI, Quezon City to strictly observe the health and safety measures recommended and ordered by the National Government and the Quezon City Government pertaining to the management of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) situation and providing specific precautionary measures in compliance therewith.

The following precautionary measures shall be strictly observed by all such business establishments in compliance with the above-mentioned directives:

1. Stringent Social Distancing shall be exercised by all persons inside or within the establishment, which requires a distance of at least one (1) meter from each other;
2. Alcohol (70%) and hand sanitizer shall be provided at the main door of every establishment;
3. The number of persons inside or within the establishment shall be limited to one (1) person per one square meter (1sqm.) per open floor, most especially at the supermarkets, grocery stores, drugstores, pharmacies, convenience stores, commercial banks, bayad centers, and personal services;
4. Regular cleaning and disinfection within the premises of the establishment shall be regularly conducted; and
5. Any kind of non-essential social functions or gatherings shall be strictly prohibited.

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately and all prior Executive Order that are inconsistent herewith are abrogated or amended accordingly.

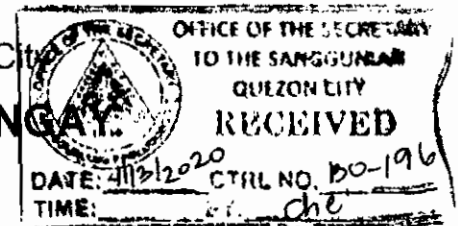

WHEREAS, following the proclamation of President Rodrigo R. Duterte and the recommendations of the ITAF-EID, more particularly the imposition of wide-ranging emergency health and safety measures, the Quezon City Mayor Josefina G. Belmonte-Alimurung issued Executive Order No. 19 entitled, "Emergency Measures Against COVID-19", dated 13 March 2020;

WHEREAS, in compliance with the directives of the National Government and the Quezon City Government, the Barangay Talipapa has adopted Barangay Resolution No. SB-026, S-2020 and issued Executive Order No. E-003, S-2020;

WHEREAS, for better implementation of the said directives, as well as the emergency health and safety measures recommended by the ITAF-IED, it is necessary that a task force be organized who shall primarily monitor the implementation of the said measures and the corresponding guidelines established therefor in Barangay Talipapa, Quezon City;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Punong Barangay of Barangay Talipapa, District 6, Quezon City, I do hereby order the organization of the "Barangay Talipapa Task Force Anti-Covid-19" who shall closely monitor the implementation of the safety measures and directives of the National Government and the Quezon City Government pertaining to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) situation:

Section 1. COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF MEMBERS OF THE "BARANGAY TALIPAPA TASK FORCE ANTI-COVID-19". The "BARANGAY TALIPAPA TASK FORCE ANTI-COVID-19" shall be composed of the following:

1.1. Over-all Head: The Punong Barangay

As the Task Force's Over-all Head, he shall receive report/s and/or recommendations for final decision and/or approval, and/or appropriate action, and relay/delegate course of action to Task Force Members and Implementers.

1.2. Secretariat: Barangay Secretary Laureano M. Casado and Barangay Staff Sheryl Santos

- a. Ensure preparation and/or adoption of barangay resolutions and executive orders related to COVID-19;
- b. Disseminate letters and correspondence to implementers;
- c. Ensure smooth coordination with the Office of the Mayor, Barangay and Community Relations Department (BCRD), Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), and other national and local agencies;
- d. Coordinate with members of the task force;
- e. Collate documentation on the activities conducted relative to COVID-19, such as photos, report, figures, etc.).

1.3. Lead Logistics: Barangay Treasurer Rhodora Cecilia C. Constantino and Bookkeeper ARJAY ROMMEL BLANDO

- a. Immediately facilitate procurement of all supplies, materials and equipment to be used by the Task Force, for which funds shall be taken out from the Quick Response Fund (QRF) of the Barangay;
- b. Coordinate with the City Accounting Department, City Budget Department, and Commission on Audit relative to the procurement of the said supplies, materials, and equipment;
- c. Ensure provision of supplies and materials of Task Force Command Center (Justice Hall) and Mobile Outpost;

- d. Oversee skeletal workforce attendance of the barangay employees and personnel;
- e. Ensure reload/replenishment of functional task force members in action;
- f. Coordinate and ensure receipt of the letters and notices provided to business establishments as to strict implementation of social distancing and cleaning and disinfecting measures;
- g. Facilitate filing of complaint for cancellation of clearance and/or suspension of operations and/or closure of establishments, in violation of the existing laws and regulations imposed and/or adopted by the National Government, Quezon City Government, and the Barangay;
- h. Facilitate disclosure protocols in business establishments;

1.4. Lead Barangay-Based Institutions (BBI's): Barangay Health Emergency Response Team (BHERT), Barangay Health Management Council (BHMC), and Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (BDRRMC)

- a. Ensure strict observance of protocols for Persons Under Monitoring (PUM's) and Persons Under Investigation (PUI's);
- b. Conduct emergency response and/or investigation of possible PUM's and PUI's;
- c. Capacitate all Implementers on how to determine PUM's and PUI's based on their disclosure of the symptoms, travel history, and close contacts;
- d. Coordinate and/or work with the Quezon City Health Department, Tandang Sora Health Center, QCDRRMO, Talipapa Fire Sub-station and other corresponding city agencies or task force;
- e. Facilitate clean-up drives and disinfection of public places;
- f. Capacitate all Implementers on City Guidelines on Cleaning and Disinfecting;
- g. Craft and Recommend Barangay Quarantine Plan/Contingency Measures;
- h. Ensure effective implementation and/or monitoring of boundary closures;
- i. Ensure efficient rationing and provision of health care; and
- j. Determine possible area cluster quarantine scenario.

Further, JUPITER GALOLO and SONIA CAPANGPANGAN are hereby designated as the focal persons for the said lead BBI's.

1.5. Lead Information, Education, and Communication Campaign (IEC): Barangay Administrator Michael Santos, Barangay Staff and Employees, BBI's Focal Persons

- a. Facilitate Information, Education, and Communication Campaign to all residents, business establishments, and organizations;
- b. Promote and disseminate information and awareness on social distancing;
- c. Promote and ensure cleaning and disinfecting measures within the Barangay;
- d. Promote proper handwashing and other safety and health measures;
- e. Ensure and monitor reporting of Implementers;
- f. Ensure compliance with disclosure protocols and determine after assessment of PUM's or PUI's;

- g. Facilitate and/or oversee the distribution of letters, leaflets, supplies and materials, equipment, etc. to Implementers;
- h. Facilitate and/or oversee creation and installation of Informative Tarpaulins; and
- i. Oversee installation of Social Distancing Markers (Yellow Tape, Masking Tape, etc.).

1.6. Lead Enforcement: All Barangay Officials, members of the Lupon Tagapamayapa, Barangay Public Safety Officers (BPSO's), EMO's, and deputized traffic and environmental enforcers

- a. Ensure manning of and open and continuous communication with the Command Center, Mobile Outposts, and Implementers;
- b. Ensure roving of whole areas and gathering of reports from the Implementers;
- c. Ensure strict compliance with social distancing in business establishments and organizations;
- d. Ensure strict compliance with cleaning and disinfecting measures;
- e. Ensure, coordinate, facilitate, coordinate incident reports/requests to Task Force Members;
- f. Establish Clustering and area of responsibility for Implementers;
- g. Respond and validate complaints/reports of Implementers;
- h. Coordinate and/or work with PNP Talipapa Police Station 3;
- i. Ensure strict compliance with public safety hours in Quezon City from 8:00 P.M. to 5:00 A.M.;
- j. Capacitate Implementers on prohibitions, penalties and exemptions on the implementation of public safety hours;
- k. Identify violators and recommend suspension and/or closure of business establishments (especially those operating without clearance and/or permit);
- l. Provide back-up / assistance to IEC and BBI;
- m. Facilitate Mobile Public Address System;
- n. File necessary case/s for habitual violators.

Further, Kagawad Willy M. Solano is hereby designated as the Focal Person of the Lead Enforcement.

1.7. Implementers: All Barangay employees, all Neighborhood Watch Group (NWG) volunteers, all homeowners' associations, NGO's, PO's, and all residents and business establishments in Barangay Talipapa, Quezon City

- a. Report incidents / possible cases of PUM and PUI to Enforcement;
- b. Strictly observe social distancing and clean personal hygiene; and
- c. Obey and implement all lawful orders.

Section 2. MANDATORY COORDINATION OF LEAD BBI'S. All lead barangay-based institutions hereby designated as such shall coordinate and report to the Barangay Personnel under the control and supervision of the Punong Barangay.

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately and all prior Executive Order that are inconsistent herewith are abrogated or amended accordingly.


