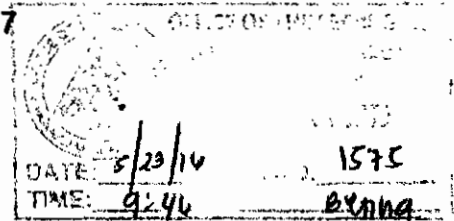

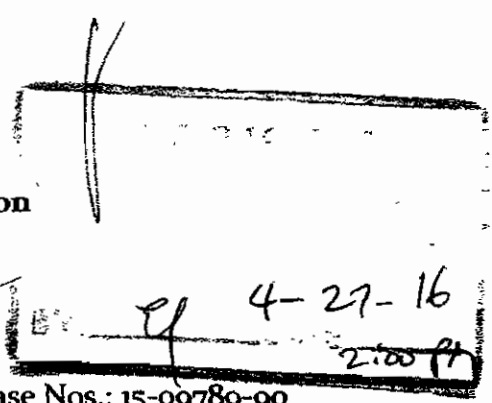

MOTION FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE OF THE ACCUSED  
ON HER OWN RECOGNIZANCE

COMES NOW, accused JOY PAULO y NATIVIDAD, assisted by the Public Attorney's Office, by and through the undersigned counsel, unto this Honorable Court, and in support thereof, most respectfully states the following:

1. Section 15, Rule 114 of the Revised Rules of Criminal Procedure provides:  
  
"Recognizance. - Whenever allowed pursuant to law or these Rules, the court may release a person in custody on his own recognizance or that of a responsible person.";
2. Recently, the Fifteenth Congress enacted into law R.A. No. 10389, otherwise known as the "Recognizance Act of 2012". Section 5(b) of the said law provides:  
  
"xxx That a person in custody for a period equal to or more than the minimum of the principal penalty prescribed for the offense charged, without application of the Indeterminate Sentence Law, or any modifying circumstance, shall be released on the person's recognizance.";
3. Upon the other hand, Section 5 of A.M. No. 12-11-2-SC, entitled "Guidelines for Decongesting Holding Jails by Enforcing the Rights of Accused Persons to Bail and to Speedy Trial", states:  
  
"Release after service of minimum imposable penalty. - The accused who has been detained for a period at least equal to the minimum of the penalty for the offense charged against him shall be ordered released, motu proprio or on motion and after notice and hearing, on his own recognizance without prejudice to the continuation of the proceedings against him.";
4. Accused was charged for Violation of Section 12, Article II of R.A. No. 9165. It provides:  
  
"Possession of Equipment, Instrument, Apparatus and Other Paraphernalia for Dangerous Drugs. - The penalty of imprisonment ranging from six (6) months and one (1) day to four (4) years and a fine ranging from Ten thousand pesos, (P10,000.00) to Fifty thousand pesos

(P50,000.00) shall be imposed upon any person, who unless authorized by law, shall possess or have under his/her control any equipment, instrument, apparatus and other paraphernalia fit or intended for smoking, consuming, administering, injecting, ingesting, or introducing any dangerous drug into the body: xxx.”;

5. Accused has been detained in the Beauru of Jail Management and Penology, Quezon City Female Dormitory since October 26, 2015. A copy of her Certificate of Detention is hereto attached as Annex “A”;
6. Accordingly, accused was detained already for more than six (6) months and one (1) day and had served the minimum of the principal penalty;
7. Considering that the period of detention of the accused is more than the minimum of the principal penalty of “six (6) months and one (1) day” prescribed for the offense charged, accused may now be released on her own recognizance;
8. Accused belongs to indigent families of Brgy. San Isidro Labrador, Quezon City and as such, is incapable either to post cash bail or bail bond, or proffer any personal or real property acceptable as sufficient sureties for a property bond. Furthermore, there is no prevailing circumstance/s that would constitute a valid ground for the court to disqualify her from being release on her own recognizance. If ever granted by the Honorable Court, accused undertakes to appear before the said court during the remainder of the hearing of her case. She, further, manifest that her non-appearance, upon due notice, will constitute a voluntary waiver of her right to be present at all times of the proceedings.

#### PRAYER

**PREMISES CONSIDERED**, it is most respectfully prayed of this Honorable Court that an Order be issued for the immediate **RELEASE** of accused **JOY PAULO y NATIVIDAD** on her own recognizance, without prejudice to the continuation of the trial.


Other relief and remedies, just and equitable under the premises, are likewise prayed for.

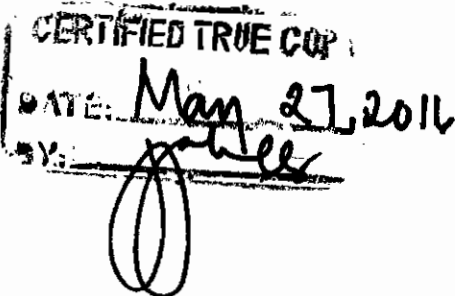

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A TASK FORCE TO REGULATE AND MONITOR THE INSTALLATION OF POLES AND DISTRIBUTION LINES AND ENSURE ITS PROPER AND SAFE MAINTENANCE OF EVERY POWER OR ELECTRICITY GENERATING COMPANY, TELEPHONE, COMMUNICATION AND COMMUNITY CABLE ANTENNA TELEVISION UTILITIES WITHIN QUEZON CITY.

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WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that " Every local government unit shall exercise the powers, expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effected governance, and those of which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things, xxxxx convenience of their inhabitants;

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WHEREAS, Section 458 (5) (viii) of the same Code empowers the Sangguniang Panlungsod of every city to: xxxxxxxx, regulate the placing of poles, and xxxxx; adopt measures to ensure public safety against xxxxxx, live wires, and other similar hazards, to the life and property;

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the City Government to adopt measures to suppress nuisances and illegal structures that pose risk to the safety of the populace of Quezon City;

WHEREAS, the operation of public utility companies is a matter of privilege vested by authority of a legislative franchise and is thus vested with public interest;

WHEREAS, there are existing laws and ordinances that govern the operations and infrastructural standards of utility companies such as the National Building Code, the Philippine Electrical Code, Philippines Electronics Code and the rules and guidelines set by proper administrative agencies, yet those laws need to be supplemented by a local legislation that will further assure safety, convenience and protection of the people who are directly served by these public utility companies;

WHEREAS, the promotion and enhancement of the aesthetics of roads, plazas, buildings and public places is one of the urban upgrading thrust of the city government;

WHEREAS, dangling wires and “ spaghetti “ cables not only have become eyesore which divest the beauty of the city’s historic buildings and cityscape, to the impairment of our growing tourism industry but also, poses safety and health hazard among our people, which cause fire, accident and disaster;

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NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

ARTICLE I.- GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. TITLE – This ordinance shall be known as the “Anti-Dangling Wire Task Force Ordinance of Quezon City “.

SECTION 2. PRESCRIBED ACT- There is hereby created a Joint Executive-Legislative Task force to regulate and monitor all transmission and distribution lines of electricity utilities, telephone, communications and community cable antenna television utilities operating within Quezon City.

SECTION 3. COMPOSITION OF THE TASK FORCE – The Joint Executive-Legislative Task Force shall be composed of the following:

- a. The Head of the City Engineering Department or his authorized representative as Task Force Chairperson;
- b. The Head of the Office of the Building Official or his authorized representative as Task Force Co-Vice-Chairperson;
- c. The Head of the Department of Public Order and Safety or his authorized representative as Task Force Co-Vice- Chairperson;
- d. The City Secretary or his duly authorized representative;
- e. The Chairman of Public Order and Safety as member;

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- f. The Chairman of Public works and infrastructure as member;*
- g. President of the Liga ng mga barangay;*
- h. Representatives from the Department of Public Works and Highway;*
- i. Representatives from the Metro Manila Development Authority;*
- j. Representatives from the private sector representing each electric utility;*
- k. Representatives from the private sector representing each Telephone Company;*
- l. Representatives from each of the CCTV and Cable companies.*

**SECTION 4. POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE TASK FORCE – The Joint Executive-Legislative Task Force shall have the following powers:**

- a. The task force shall have the power to ensure compliance, examine and determine whether suppliers, installers and contractors of electric transmission and distribution lines, and cables of telephone, communications and community cable antenna television companies, complies with the safety standards and qualifications set out by applicable laws, rules and regulations, specifically in terms of maintenance and installation of cable, transmission and distribution lines, observing proper attire/ uniform and behavior, and compliance with safety protocols in personal protective equipment (PPE), and other related*

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accessories. Accordingly, the task force shall notify and enable the concerned utility to resolve any reported concern within reasonable time.

- b. To enforce the rules and regulations, code requirements and governing laws regarding the aforesaid poles and distribution lines such as those embodied in the Philippine Electrical Code part 1 and 2, the National Building Code (P.D. No. 1906). The said enforcement is to ensure compliance with the applicable laws, rules and regulations shall be made possible by notifying and enabling the concerned utility to resolve any reported concern within reasonable time or by reporting such matter of non-compliance to the proper governmental agencies capable of enforcing and penalizing such utilities.
- c. Gather, review and address all reports, notices, complaints and such other relevant information relating to any cables, wires, distribution lines and poles which may or have been installed within the jurisdiction of Quezon City.
- d. Formulate a corrective action plan and time table that will address all reports, notices, and complaints which have been submitted, including complaints or reports filed by any of the members of the task force, for appropriate action.
- e. Provide recommendatory action for the repair and abatement of any cable, wire, distribution line which fails to meet the required tension mandated by law and ensure that the same are not sagging and within he prescribed



*tension limits, as well as any pole which fails to meet the required tillage of pole to any Local Government Agency, Office and Department, including the public sector and removal of any unused or unutilized lines that pose danger to safety.*

- f. Promulgate such other rules and regulations that will govern the administration of the Task Force in the execution of its functions and powers.*

**SECTION 5. ROLE OF THE EXECUTIVE DEPARMENT -**  
*The City Engineering Department, Building Official and Department of Public Order and Safety shall undertake the following:*

- a. Conduct monthly meetings with the members of the task force and arrange for its logistics, in order to monitor the progress of the implementation of this ordinance.*
- b. Coordinate with the local Barangay in order to receive reports and complaints with regard to any wire, cable, transmission line and poles.*
- c. Identify priority areas which need immediate repair or abatement.*
- d. City engineering department or his duly authorized representative sitting as chairperson shall preside over all meetings of the taskforce.*

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- e. *The Building Official or Department of Public Order and Safety or their duly authorized representative shall exercise such functions of the chairman in the absence of the latter.*
- f. *The City Secretary or his authorized representative shall document and record all matters discussed during the meetings of the task force.*

**SECTION 6. ROLE OF THE LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT -**  
*The Chairman on Public Order and Safety and the Chairman of Public Works and Infrastructure shall undertake the following:*

- a. *Serve as liaison with the concerned utilities in charge with the repair and abatement of any report or complaints regarding wires, cables, transmission lines and poles.*
- b. *Prepare and propose resolutions and ordinances which will address the problems and issues which have been raised to the taskforce and requires legislation.*
- c. *Research, collate and compile existing ordinances and resolutions which are relevant to the purpose of the Task Force and if necessary, propose amendments or modifications to the same during session of the Quezon City Council.*

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- d. Represent the general welfare of the city by raising issues of the public and voice out the latter's concerns with regard to safety, security and ensure implementation of ordinances in aid of legislation.*

*SECTION 7. ROLE OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR – The representatives of the electricity utilities, Cable Companies, CCTV companies and Telephone Companies shall undertake the following:*

- a. Act as representative and Serve as liaison with the proper private companies who own, operate and control wires, cables, transmission lines and poles in need of repair.*
- b. Actively participate in the task force's goal of clearing and/or repairing unused, inactive and/or sagging wires, cables and transmission lines and repair or abate poles which are in danger of falling.*
- c. Submit reports to the Task Force regarding concerns of the utilities in order to expeditiously implement the projects, as may be necessary, for appropriate action.*

*SECTION 8. MANDATORY PARTICIPATION – In order to ensure proper representation of all utility companies operating or have cables, transmission or distribution lines and poles within.*

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**SECTION 8. MEETINGS** – The task force shall have a regular meeting to be conducted every 2<sup>nd</sup> week of the month to exercise the functions and duties defined in this ordinance. Members of the task force shall be notified of the time and date of the meeting or any changes concerning the same

**SECTION 9. BARANGAY PARTICIPATION** – Within thirty (30) days from the promulgation of this ordinance, all local barangay units within the jurisdiction of Quezon City is instructed to investigate, receive complaints and thereafter report to the task force any wires, cables, transmission lines and poles that are in need of repair or requires to be abated on account of the same posing serious threat or danger to safety of the general public if left unrepaired.

**SECTION 10. PENALTIES AND FINES.** - In the event the utility company fails to act upon the powers/duties stated in Section 4 or participate in the task force as stated in section 7. The following penalties shall be imposed:

- a. First Offense – One Thousand Pesos  
(P1,000.00)
- b. Second Offense – Three Thousand Pesos  
(P3,000.00)
- c. Third Offense or More – Five Thousand Pesos  
(P5,000.00)

**SECTION 11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE** – If any provision or portion of this ordinance is found to be a violation of the constitution and is declared invalid, the provisions or portion hereof which are not so declared shall remain to be in full force and effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1. Article II, Section 1 (2) of Book IV prescribing *Requirements for Application of New Franchise* is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.) Certification from the Barangay where: a) the applicant is a bonafide resident of the Barangay and a qualified voter within Quezon City and the unit applied for is actually operating within the said barangay; or b) In case the TODA where the applicant is a member operates in several contiguous barangays, the clearance may be applied in any of the said barangays.

Section 2. Article XVI of Book IV under *Prohibited Acts of Drivers* the following words shall be included in the first paragraph of this article, to wit:

The following acts constitute sufficient grounds for the revocation and confiscation of the drivers permit/ID Card, confiscation of the driver's license and/or impounding of the tricycle unit as the case may be.

Section 3. Article XVII Section 6 of Book IV shall include the following clause as item no. 4, to wit:

4. TODA officers and members allowing colorum tricycle units to utilize their terminal.

Section 4. Article XX, Section 1 (23) and (24) relating to *Violations and Penalties* is hereby amended, also to be inserted is item no. 40 to which said provision shall now be read as:

**Section 5.** Article XX, Section 2(23) and (24) relating to *Impounding* shall include additional items to be read as:

8. Operating a tricycle without a franchise (Colorum Operation)

9. Operating a tricycle with and expired/delinquent franchise/MTOP and expired/unregistered LTO/TRU registration

10. For other violations not indicated above, the driver's license may be confiscated

**Section 6.** ARTICLE XX, Section 4 of Book IV relating to *Public Auction* is hereby amended to read as follows:

**Section 4. PUBLIC AUCTION.** All sidecars of tricycles impounded by the City Government in accordance with the preceding section shall be subject to public auction. The rules promulgated by City government in public auctions shall apply. Fifty percent (50%) of the proceeds of said auction shall be utilized for special funds to finance livelihood projects and assistance under Book V of this Code. The other half of the proceeds shall be used for the operating and incidental expenses of the Tricycle Regulations Unit.

Further, all tricycle units impounded for operating without franchise (colorum operation) for one (1) year or more from the date of apprehension prior to the enactment of this Ordinance, regardless of the frequency of the offense committed, are covered by this Code and are subject to the mandatory removal of sidecar. The same shall be subject to public auction.



Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things, the preservation and enrichment of culture, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, improve public morals, enhance economic prosperity and social justice, promote full employment among their residents, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants;

**WHEREAS**, Section 16 of Republic Act 7160 also provides that every local government unit may, through its local chief executive and with the concurrence of the sanggunian concerned, provide assistance, financial or otherwise, to such people's and nongovernmental organizations for economic, socially-oriented, environmental, or cultural projects to be implemented within its territorial jurisdiction;

**WHEREAS**, volunteer firefighter brigades are the active partner of the government in helping to prevent and lessen the effect of fire incident not only in our city but in the entire country as well;


**WHEREAS**, to boost the morale and to increase the spirit of volunteerism to the members of volunteer firefighter brigade, it is timely and just to waive the vehicle registration fees of their fire trucks as a token of gratitude from the Government.

**NOW, THEREFORE,**

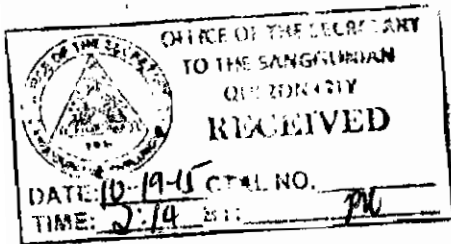

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_\_, S-2015

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF CITY-OWNED STREET FURNITURE SUCH AS LAMP POSTS, WAITING SHEDS, COMMUTER STATIONS AND OTHER SIMILAR FACILITIES FOR ADVERTISING AND OTHER PURPOSES.**

Introduced by Councilor **ANTHONY PETER P. CRISOLOGO, ANDRES JOSE G. YLLANA, ALEXIS R. HERRERA, VINCENT DG. BELMONTE, JR.**

**WHEREAS**, as part of the delivery of basic services to the general public, as well as a means of increasing security and safety within Quezon City the Local Government of Quezon City has already installed and established various street utilities throughout its territorial jurisdiction.

**WHEREAS**, the aforesaid street utilities installed and established by the Local Government of Quezon City have been utilized by various private companies or individuals for advertising and announcement purposes of which the Local Government of Quezon City has not derive any benefit from the same.

**WHEREAS**, on account of the proliferation of such advertisements and announcements the Local Government of Quezon City has determined that there is already a need to regulate and control the placement of such advertising materials and announcement in order to ensure that the aforesaid street utilities would be properly maintained as part of its strategy in ensuring sustainable development in Quezon City.

**WHEREAS**, it is a declared policy of the State to recognize the indispensable role of the private sector as the main engine for national growth and development and provide appropriate incentives to mobilize private resources for the purpose of financing the construction, operation and maintenance of infrastructure and development projects normally financed and undertaken by the government pursuant to Republic Act 7718.

**WHEREAS**, it is the mandate of Republic Act No.7160 otherwise known as the LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF THE PHILIPPINES, section 3 paragraphs (I) thereof that the participation of the private sector in the delivery of basic services as an alternative strategy for sustainable development of local autonomy is encouraged.

**NOW, THEREFORE,**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:**

**SECTION 1. TITLE.** This ordinance shall be known as the **"THE ADVERTISING AND ANNOUNCEMENT ORDINANCE OF 2015"**.

**SECTION 2. COVERAGE.** This ordinance shall apply to all government owned and installed lamp post, street light, commuter stations, waiting sheds, street furniture and other utility structures which have been created, installed and developed by the Local Government of Quezon City or for its benefit thereof within its territorial jurisdiction.

**SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS.** The following words when utilized in this ordinance shall have the following meaning.

**STREET UTILITY/ UTILITIES** any government utility installed within the territorial jurisdiction of Quezon City which may be located within the streets of Quezon City whose primary function is to provide, temporary shelter and/or lighting to the general public which may commonly be identified as Lamp Posts, Street Lights, Waiting Sheds Commuter Stations and street furniture.

**PRIVATE SECTOR** any third party individual or judicial entity not affiliated to the government or any government owned and controlled corporation and is generally managed and owned by private citizens.

**ADVERTISEMENTS** shall include any signage, announcement or notice intended to be placed in any STREET UTILITY for purposed of promotion, campaign or propaganda in order to notify the general public.

**SECTION 4. APPLICATION.** Any private individual or judicial entity who desires to place an advertisement or announcement utilizing any STREET UTILITY shall submit an application with the Business Permit and Licensing Office of Quezon City the contents of the application shall contain the following:

- A. The name, address and contact numbers of the Applicant
- B. A reproduction of the advertisement to be placed in the street utility.
- C. The dimensions of the advertisement to be placed.
- D. The proposed location where the advertisement would be placed.
- E. The target date and duration of when the advertisement would be placed.

In addition to the application submitted by the private individual or judicial entity, the latter shall likewise submit the following documentary requirements.

- A. For private individuals and partnerships, a copy of their Department of Trade and Industry registration. For corporations a copy of its Certificate of Registration issued by Securities and Exchange Commission.
- B. Payment of application fee in the amount of 1,500 pesos.

**SECTION 5. REVIEW.** Once the application has been received by the Business Processing Licensing Office the aforesaid application shall be reviewed by the latter and within 5 days thereof issue its recommendations of its approval or disapproval.

**SECTION 6. APPROVAL.** Once the application has been approved the Applicant shall be notified thereof and shall be issued a Certificate of Approval. Thereafter the certificate of approval shall be forwarded to the Local City Council for appropriate action.

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**SECTION 7. THE CITY COUNCIL.** The Certificate of Approval shall be transmitted to the proper city council office having jurisdiction over the proposed location where the advertisement would be placed. The City Councillor concerned shall then submit a resolution to the City Council in order to authorize the City Mayor to enter into a MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT with the applicant for the use of the street utility for advertisement purposes.

**SECTION 8. THE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.** Once the Resolution has been duly approved by the City Council, the Office of the City Mayor shall execute a Memorandum of Agreement which shall provided~~ed~~ the minimum terms and conditions of the use for advertisement purposes of the government owned street utility.

No memorandum of agreement to be executed between the Applicant with the Local Government of Quezon City shall be approved unless it contains the following minimum requirements:

- A. The duration or term of the memorandum of agreement, which must not be less than six months.
- B. The monthly fee to be paid by the private individual or judicial entity.
- C. The obligation of the private individual or judicial entity to care, maintain, repair or rebuild the street utility utilized by it.
- D. And such other terms and conditions which would govern the agreement to be executed by the parties.

**SECTION 9. EXISTING ADVERTISEMENTS** No advertisement shall be placed in any STREET UTILITY unless the same has been duly approved by the Business Permit and Licensing Office of Quezon City, all existing advertisements not in compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be removed by the City Engineering office without prejudice to any penalties that may be imposed hereof.

**SECTION 10. FINES AND PENALTIES.** It shall be unlawful to install, place, or establish any advertisement in any street utility without first securing the proper approval required by this Ordinance. in case of violation thereof, a fine of not less than 20,000 pesos but not more than 50,000 pesos or imprisonment of not less than one month not more than six months shall be imposed.

In case the offender is a judicial entity the officer or director who signed the Memorandum of Agreement shall be made liable.

**SECTION 11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** If any provision of this ORDINANCE or the application thereof is to any person or circumstance declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same shall not affect the validity of the other provisions.

**SECTION 12. REPEALING CLAUSE.** All ordinances, rules and regulations or parts thereof contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.







**PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. PO19CC-521, S-2015**

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF CITY-OWNED STREET FURNITURE SUCH AS LAMP POSTS, WAITING SHEDS, COMMUTER STATIONS AND OTHER SIMILAR FACILITIES FOR ADVERTISING AND OTHER PURPOSES.**

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Introduced by **COUNCILORS ANTHONY PETER D. CRISOLOGO, ANDRES JOSE G. YLLANA, ALEXIS R. HERRERA, and VINCENT DG. BELMONTE JR.**

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**WHEREAS**, as part of the delivery of basic services to the general public, as well as a means of increasing security and safety within Quezon City, the Local Government of Quezon City has already installed and established various street utilities throughout its territorial jurisdiction.

**WHEREAS**, the aforesaid street utilities installed and established by the Local Government of Quezon City have been utilized by various private companies or individuals for advertising and announcement purposes of which the Local Government of Quezon City has not derive any benefit from the same.

**WHEREAS**, on account of the proliferation of such advertisements and announcements the Local Government of Quezon City has determined that there is already a need to regulate and control the placement of such advertising materials and announcement in order to ensure that the aforesaid street utilities would be properly maintained as part of its strategy in ensuring sustainable development in Quezon City.

**WHEREAS**, it is a declared policy of the State to recognize the indispensable role of the private sector as the main engine for national growth and development and provide appropriate incentives to mobilize private resources for the purpose of financing the construction, operation and maintenance of infrastructure and development projects normally financed and undertaken by the government pursuant to Republic Act 7718.

**WHEREAS**, it is the mandate of Republic Act No.7160 otherwise known as the LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF THE PHILIPPINES, Section 3 (I) thereof that the participation of the private sector in the delivery of basic services as an alternative strategy for sustainable development of local autonomy is encouraged.

**NOW, THEREFORE,**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:**

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**SECTION 1. Title.** This ordinance shall be known as the “ADVERTISING AND ANOUNCEMENT ORDINANCE OF 2015”.

**SECTION 2. Coverage.** This ordinance shall apply to all government owned and installed lamp post, street light, commuter stations, waiting sheds, street furniture and other utility structures which have been created, installed and developed by the Local Government of Quezon City or for its benefit thereof within its territorial jurisdiction.

**SECTION 3. Definition of Terms.** The following words when utilized in this ordinance shall have the following meaning;

- A. ADVERTISEMENTS** – shall include any signage, announcement or notice intended to be placed in any STREET UTILITY for purposes of promotion, campaign or propaganda in order to notify the general public.
- B. LAMP POST** – any government lamp post installed throughout the streets and main thoroughfare of Quezon City which is owned and maintained by the local government.
- C. PRIVATE SECTOR** – any third party individual or judicial entity not affiliated to the government or any government owned and controlled corporation and is generally managed and owned by private citizens.
- D. STREET FURNITURE** – any form of furniture installed throughout the city usually in the form of benches, seats and exercise equipment intended for the general use of the public.
- E. STREET LIGHTS** – any form of lighting apparatus installed and maintained by the local government of Quezon City whose primary function is to provide lighting to the streets.
- F. STREET UTILITIES** – any government utility installed within the territorial jurisdiction of Quezon City which may be located within the streets of Quezon City whose primary function is to provide, temporary shelter and/or lighting to the general public which may commonly be identified as Lamp Posts, Street Lights, Waiting Sheds Commuter Stations and street furniture.
- G. WAITING SHEDS/COMMUTER STATIONS** – any form of structure established by the local government of Quezon City whose primary function is to provide temporary shelter to the general public.

**SECTION 4. Procedures.**

- 4.1 LETTER OF REQUEST.** Any private individual or judicial entity who desires to make use of any STREET UTILITY for advertising or announcement purposes shall submit to the Office of the City

Mayor a letter of request to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement concerning the same.

Thereafter, the Office of the City Mayor shall endorse such letter to the City Council, and while during its regular session shall take up such matter in order to ratify the authority of the City Mayor to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the above mentioned party.

No Memorandum of Agreement concerning the same shall be considered valid and binding upon the Local Government of Quezon City unless the same has been duly ratified by the City Council.

**4.2 THE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.** The Memorandum of Agreement to be executed between the Office of the City Mayor and the above mentioned applicant must contain the following minimum requirements. Absent such minimum requirements the same shall be considered null and void.

**4.2.1** The duration or term of the memorandum of agreement, this must not be less than six months but not more than one year.

**4.2.2** A stipulation stating that the Quezon City government shall be given priority in the event the latter is in need of advertisement space and that in the event there is a conflict regarding the utilization of the advertisement space the Quezon City government shall be given preference.

**4.2.3** The monthly fee to be paid by the private individual or judicial entity per advertising or announcement sign to be placed.

**4.2.4** The obligation of the private individual or judicial entity to care, maintain, repairs or rebuild the street utility utilized by it.

**4.2.5** The obligation of the private individual or judicial entity to remove and restore to its original form the street utility utilized by it.

**4.2.6** And such other terms and conditions which would govern the agreement to be executed by the parties.

The applicant shall then apply for a sign permit with Office of the Building Official, Sign Office, and the application shall contain the following:

**A.** The name, address and contact numbers of the Applicant;

**B.** A reproduction of the advertisement to be placed in the street utility, which must have the sign and seal of Quezon City;

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- C. The dimensions of the advertisement to be placed;
- D. The proposed location where the advertisement would be placed;
- E. The target date and duration of when the advertisement would be placed;
- F. For private individuals and partnerships. A copy of their Department of Trade and Industry registration. For corporations a copy of its Certificate of Registration issued by Securities and Exchange Commission;

The applicant shall pay the corresponding fees after assessment by the Office of the Building Official, Sign Office.

**SECTION 5. Removal.** Upon termination of the agreement entered into by the Applicant and the Local Government of Quezon City the advertisements placed by the Applicant shall be removed and the Street Utility utilized shall be restored to its original form by the Applicant in the event the Applicant fails to remove the advertisement placed or restore such Street Utility to its original form within 15 days from the expiration of Memorandum of Agreement entered into, the office of the City Mayor or such department as may be appointed by the latter shall order the removal of the advertisement and/or restoration of the Street Utility, in such case all expenses incurred by the Local Government of Quezon City relative to the removal of the advertisement and/or restoration of the street utility shall be paid by the Applicant without prejudice to such fines and penalties as may be imposed herein.

**SECTION 6. Existing Advertisements.** No advertisement shall be placed in any STREET UTILITY unless the same has been duly approved by the Business Permit and Licensing Office of Quezon City, all existing advertisements not in compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be removed by the City Engineering office without prejudice to any penalties that may be imposed hereof.

**SECTION 7. Prohibitions.** In no case shall any advertisement or announcement sought to be displayed in any Street Utility contain any images or words which may be considered obscene, offensive, or contrary to common morals and decency.

**SECTION 8. Fines and Penalties.** It shall be unlawful to install, place, or establish any advertisement in any street utility without first securing the proper approval required by this Ordinance, in case of violation thereof, a fine of not less than 1,000 pesos but not more than 5,000 pesos or imprisonment of not less than one month not more than six months shall be imposed.

In case the offender is a judicial entity the officer or director shall be made liable.

In case of failure to remove an advertisement and/or restore a street utility to its original form upon the termination of the Memorandum of Agreement, the applicant shall be liable to pay a penalty of 1,000 pesos per month plus the agreed monthly rate provided for in the Memorandum of Agreement until such advertisement has been removed or restored.

**SECTION 9. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.*** In the implementation of the provisions of this ordinance, the Office of the City Mayor in consultation with the City Planning Office shall formulate necessary standards, rules and regulations needed for the implementation of this ordinance. Such standards, rules and regulations shall take effect after the publication once a week for three (3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation.



## ORDINANCE NO. 01- SERIES OF 2016

**AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ANY PERSON, PRIVATE OR CORPORATION, TO POST CASH BOND IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS ONLY (P100,000.00) OR ONE PERCENT (1%) OF THE TOTAL COST PRICE OF THE PROJECT TO BE IMPLEMENTED IN BARANGAY SILANGAN, WHICHEVER IS HIGHER, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.**

**– KGD. ROMEO O. ABAY and KGD. RODOLFO C. RIGO JR.**

**WHEREAS**, civil works conducted by contractors of utilities such as water, electricity, telecommunication and cable installation are perennial problems of all barangays in Quezon City because contractors fail to restore / return to its original form land excavated on streets, manholes remain opened after work, electric wires and cables hanging and not returned to their proper place and position, thereby posing danger to commuters and passersby;

**WHEREAS**, most of these contractors start conducting activity without securing Barangay Clearance or have secured a clearance but failed to comply with the conditions of the clearance;

**WHEREAS**, the same problem has been encountered by barangays involving contractors of medium and high rise buildings who fail to install protective and security measures as well as warning devices against falling debris and construction materials, open spaces, streets and sidewalks have been utilized as staging area, and delivery trucks occupying public spaces affecting the smooth flow of traffic to the detriment of residents, commuters and pedestrians;

**WHEREAS**, construction activity that continues until past midnight or the wee hours thereby disturbing the tranquility of the night and depriving the residents of peaceful sleep aside from security risk assumed because of the laborers or construction workers seen loitering within the area;

**WHEREAS**, the barangay clearance fee paid by contractor cannot fully cover any such possible anguish, discomfort and inconvenience suffered by residents of the barangay and the public during and after the duration of the project;

**WHEREAS**, the Sangguniang Barangay found that posting of CASH BOND is the only possible way to oblige contractors and / or private individuals to strictly fulfill their obligation and assure the security of residents and general public;

**WHEREAS**, under the General Welfare Clause, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, every local government unit shall exercise the powers necessary, appropriate or incidental to its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdiction, local governance units shall ensure and support among other things; promote health and safety, improve public morals, maintain peace and order and preserve the comfort and convenience of the inhabitants.

**WHEREAS**, Section 391 of the same code, the Sangguniang Barangay as the legislative body of the barangay, shall enact ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred upon it by law or ordinance to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants therein;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY OF SILANGAN, IN SESSION ASSEMBLED UPON MOTION DULY SECONDED, AS IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED THAT:**

Section 1. Short Title. This ordinance shall be known as the **"Barangay Cash Bond Ordinance"**

Section 2. Coverage. Any person, private or corporation before conducting civil works / constructions activity within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Silangan shall post a CASH BOND equivalent to one percent (1%) of the TOTAL COST or AMOUNT of the PROJECT or in the amount of (P 100, 000.00), whichever is higher and providing penalties for violation thereof from the government of Barangay Silangan.

Section 3. Procedure. The Applicant shall fill out before the Office of the Punong Barangay an application form for Barangay Clearance together with one (1) set of the following documents placed in an appropriate folder:

- a. Scope of Work / Program of Work including the DURATION of the project
- b. Building Plan / Layout
- c. Construction Contract or Affidavit / Sworn Statement of cost of contract
- d. Approved Location Clearance
- e. Sworn Affidavit of Undertaking to return / restore to its original form land excavated, rehabilitate canals, manholes and streets damaged, clean streets and pavements of scattered debris and spilled concrete mix, fix cables and concrete post, provide necessary identification cards to construction workers and that no construction workers shall be found littering and loitering outside the construction area anytime of the day.
- f. Such other documents like neighborhood consent or adjoining lot owner or residents manifestation of no objection that the Punong Barangay may require for the purpose of effective and efficient implementation of the herein ordinance.
- g. Formal letter requesting for permit or clearance, signed by the contractor representative and / or owner of property.

Within five (5) working days, after receipt of the application for Barangay Clearance, with complete supporting documents, the applicant shall pay to the Barangay Treasurer the Clearance Fee and post CASH BOND equivalent to one percent (1%) of the declared cost / price of the project or in the amount of P 100, 000.00 whichever is higher. The Barangay Treasurer shall issue corresponding ACKNOWLEDGMENT RECEIPT stating the details of the amount paid. Payment received from Barangay Clearance shall be credited to general fund while cash bond posted shall be placed in TRUST FUND by the Barangay Treasurer until such time that the applicant files Notice of Completion of the Project and submit a letter requesting for the return of the cash bond.

Section 4. Requirements for Claim of Refund of Cash Bond posted. The applicant after completion of the projects shall file before the Office of the Punong Barangay a Notice of Completion of the Project and submit a letter requesting for the refund of the cash bond posted. After receipt of the notice and letter, the Punong Barangay or his authorized representative shall conduct ocular inspection to determine if the applicant complied with the requirements under the sworn affidavit of undertaking executed. If found in order, the Punong Barangay shall order the return of the cash bond posted in accordance with existing auditing and accounting procedures.

**Section 5. Miscellaneous Provisions.**

- a. One percent (1%) of the posted CASH BOND shall be retained by the Barangay to answer for DAMAGES NOT FOUND during actual or ocular inspection and the corresponding amount shall be credited to the General Fund of the Barangay.
- b. Fifty percent (50%) of the posted cash bond shall be retained by the Barangay because of the failure of the applicant to fulfill his undertaking in spite of notice and demand. The retained portion of the cash bond shall be used to defray expenses incurred by the barangay.
- c. The Punong Barangay is hereby authorized to determine the existence of damages caused by the applicant and withhold the release of cash bond until such time the applicant perform his undertaking or hire the services of third party charged to the account of the applicant. In case of medium construction or construction of high rise building, the Punong Barangay shall require the applicant to clean the surroundings or clear the area of debris and construction materials scattered including spilled dry cement or concrete mix and if satisfied, shall order the release of cash bond under the condition set in paragraph 5 (a).
- d. The Punong Barangay shall be authorized to revoke the Barangay Clearance issued and submit a written recommendation to the Office of the City Mayor for cancellation of Building Permit granted.
- e. The Punong Barangay is hereby authorized to deny any request or application for subsequent barangay clearance to applicant found to have been violating the provision of the herein ordinance.
- f. The Punong Barangay is also authorized to file necessary legal action in an appropriate court, tribunal or body, against violator/s of the herein ordinance.

**Section 6. Penalty.** If the person violating the provision of the herein ordinance is a private individual, an appropriate criminal action shall be filed against him in court and if found guilty shall be fined One Thousand Pesos (P1, 000.00 or to a maximum of P 5,000.00 ) in accordance with Section 516 of the same code (such fine or other penalty, or both, shall be imposed at the discretion of the court) and in case of corporation, against the President, the Manager or its authorized representative.

**Section 7. Repealing Clause.** All ordinances, resolutions and executive orders, part or parts thereof which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.


**Section 8. Separability Clause.** If, for any reason/s, any part or provisions of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

**Section 9.** Fifteen days after monitoring, publication and upon review and confirmation / approval of the City Council, the office of the Sangguniang Barangay, Barangay Public Safety Officers and the Philippine National Police shall strictly enforce this ordinance;

**Section 10. Effectivity Clause.** This ordinance shall take effect upon review, and approval / confirmation by the Quezon City Council.



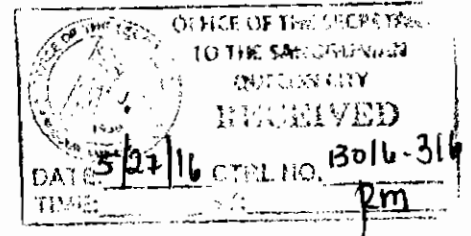

BARANGAY ORDINANCE NO.04, S-2014



**AN ORDINANCE MANDATING " DISCIPLINE HOURS " TO ALL MINORS BELOW 18 YEARS OF AGE FROM 11:00PM TO 4:00AM WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF BARANGAY VASRA AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF:**

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**Introduced by: KAGAWAD ARWHIN "Whin" S. OROLFO**  
**Co-Introduced by: KAGAWAD AMANDO MAGAYANES**

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**WHEREAS**, the Barangay Council of Barangay Vasra, in the exercise of its power expressly granted under Section 389 and 391 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, within given the responsibilities and authority necessary and appropriate for effective governance which are essential for the promotion of the general welfare of its inhabitants, ensure their comfort, safety and convenience;

**WHEREAS**, Article 11, Section 15 of the 1987 Philippines Constitution provides that the state recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual and social well-being. It shall inculcate in the youth, patriotism and nationalism and encourage their involvement in public and civil affairs;

**WHEREAS**, the Barangay Council has received several complaints coming from the residents, community association, NGO's, religious groups, public and private schools and business establishments regarding the alarming peace and order situation involving the youth occurring during midnights up to the wee hours of the morning;

**WHEREAS**, the Barangay Council conducted an evolution of the said complaints based on the Barangay Blotter Records, which confirmed that several complaints indeed involved minors who drink intoxicating liquor and used prohibited drugs that caused street fights and other disturbances of the peace, including cases of the theft, and snatching during the night;

**WHEREAS**, to attain the objectives stated herein and to arrest the deteriorating peace and order situation in the Barangay, involvement of all the Barangay Officials and all sectors of society within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Vasra, the enactment of this Ordinance is necessary and important.

**NOW, THEREFORE:**

**BE IT ORDAINED AS IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE SANGUNIANG BARANGAY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED: THAT-**

**SECTION 1.** Mandating " DISCIPLINE HOURS " to all minors below 18 years of age from 11:00pm to 4:00am, within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Vasra and prescribing penalties for violations thereof.

**SECTION 2.** it shall be lawful for any minor under the age of 18 years to stay, roam around, or meander from 11:00pm to 4:00am in public roads, streets, or any public place, including business establishments, within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Vasra whether singly or in groups, without lawful purpose or justifiable reason.

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**SECTION 3. EXCEMPTION.** The above-cited prohibition shall not apply to the following:

- a) Those who are on their way home from special occasions such as Foundation Day Celebration, graduation ceremonies, church activities, and / or other school activities wherein their presence are required;
- b) Those who, by virtue of their employment are required to stay in the streets or outside of their residences within the prohibited period from 11:00pm to 4:00am, provided they carry with them their Company Identification Cards;
- c) Those who are in the company of their parents or guardians;
- d) Those running lawful errands, such as buying food or medicines, or emergency cases;
- e) Those who are students of night school / universities provided they carry within them their school identification cards;
- f) Those who are unable to go home due to circumstances beyond their control.

**PROVIDED:** THAT IN ALL ABOVE-CITED CASES, the minors who are out in public roads, streets, and other public places, including in the premises of business establishments, during the said 'DISCIPLINE HOURS' SHOULD NOT IN ANY MANNER BE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS OR PROHIBITED DRUGS, otherwise, the said EXEMPTIONS SHALL NOT APPLY.

**SECTION 4. PENALTY CLAUSE:** Any minor caught violating this Ordinance shall be liable and penalized as follows:

- a) **FIRST OFFENSE** – The minors found violating this Ordinance for the FIRST TIME will be referred to the barangay hall for Safe Keeping / Preliminary counseling and they will be oriented together with their parents regarding discipline hours ordinance conducted by women desk/ Ex-O/ or BPSO before being properly turned over to his/her parent/s or guardian/s;
- b) **SECOND OFFENSE** - The minors found violating this Ordinance for the SECOND TIME will be referred to the barangay hall for official counseling together with their parents and will then scheduled to be handled by the BCPC.
- c) **THIRD OFFENSE** – A minor found violating this ordinance for the THIRD TIME and SUCCEEDING TIME, the parent/s or guardian/s of the minor in violation of this ordinance shall be compelled to perform community services as may be mandated by the Barangay Chairman or Kagawad on Duty, equivalent to Six (6) HOURS for every violation.
- d) **FOURTH OFFENSE** - given the intervention prescribed in the preceding paragraphs, shall be turned over to the Social Services Development Department or SSDD for appropriate counseling and proper disposition on the matter.
- e) In cases where the residence of a minor, who violates this ordinance, is that of another barangay, the provisions under paragraph (a) of herein ordinance shall be observed for first violation, in coordination with the Barangay Office/Official where the place of residence of minor in question is; or when the residence of the minor is from far away city or barangay, custody of the child shall immediately but not later than Eight (8) hours after apprehension, turn over to the Social Welfare and Development Office or other accredited NGO's and notify the child's apprehension as provided for under paragraph(i) Section 21 of RA 9344 otherwise known as the "Juvenile Justice and Welfare Act of 2006".


**SECTION 5. EFFECTIVITY** – This ordinance shall take effect upon approval of the Sangguniaang Panglungsod of Quezon City.

**SECTION 6.** Information Campaign Such us Fostering, Community Assemblies, Dialogue, Etc.. regarding this Ordinance should be implemented the whole jurisdiction of Barangay Vasra.



**RESOLUTION REQUESTING HON MAYOR HERBERT M. BAUTISTA AND THE CITY COUNCIL TO AUTHORIZE THE PUNONG BARANGAY TO USE PORTION OF THE 2016 CALAMITY FUND (1<sup>ST</sup> AND 2<sup>ND</sup> QUARTER) OF THE DULY APPROVED BARANGAY ANNUAL BUDGET AMOUNTING TO THREE HUNDRED TWELVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED FORTY FIVE PESOS AND 68/100 ONLY (PhP312,545.68) FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF SUPPLIES AND MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT TO BE USED IN THE PRE-DISASTER PREPAREDNESS PROGRAM AS AUTHORIZED UNDER REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10121 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS PHILIPPINE DISASTER REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT ACT OF 2010.**

**WHEREAS,** an amount equivalent to the mandatory five (5%) percent of total annual budget of the Barangay shall be allocated for calamity fund by the Sangguniang Barangay for disaster risk reduction and management activities and out of 5% the 30% thereof shall be allocated for Quick Response Fund or stand-by fund for relief and recovery as prescribed under Republic Act No. 10121, otherwise known as Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act. No. 2010;

**WHEREAS,** the Sangguniang Barangay decided to use portion of the calamity fund Pre-Disaster Preparedness Program in order to purchase supplies and materials and equipment, seminar/trainings for Barangay Disaster volunteers information dissemination through regular conduct of training and seminar and such other related activities to prepare the constituents of future man-made and natural calamity;

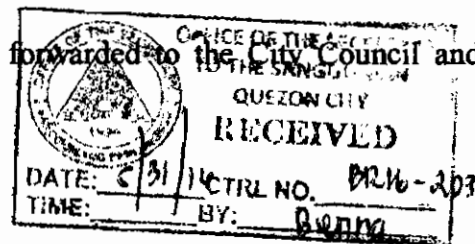
**WHEREAS,** the above stated amount shall be charged against the Calamity Fund of the approved 2016 Annual Budget;



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

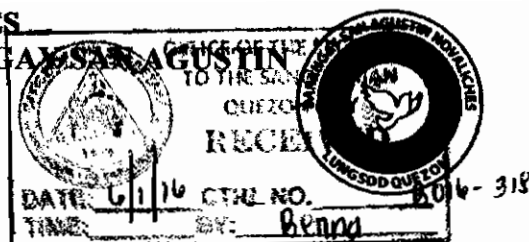

ORDINANCE NO. 03 -S-2016

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL TRANSIENT EMPLOYEES AND/OR WORKERS/LABORERS EMPLOYED AND WORKING IN BARANGAY SAN AGUSTIN TO REGISTER AND SECURE A WORKING CLEARANCE FROM BARANGAY SAN AGUSTIN, DISTRICT V, NOVALICHES, QUEZON CITY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 389 and 391 of Republic Act 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, the Sangguniang Barangay as the legislative body of the barangay has the function and authority to enact laws essential for the general welfare of its inhabitants and for the effectiveness of its governance;

WHEREAS, Barangay San Agustin is on its doorway to development as gleaned by its strategic geographical location being the crossroad to the fourteen (14) barangays of the 5<sup>th</sup> District, new building construction and open-door of business opportunities eventually resulting to increase of revenues all together with the stimulation of crime rate that must be anticipated;

WHEREAS, to address and as deterrent to these criminality and unscrupulous activities for the welfare of the general public, and for the effective delivery of basic services, it is essential to identify the transient workers and employees in commercial and industrial establishments as well as in the construction projects within Barangay San Agustin;

WHEREAS, the Barangay Council in enacting this ordinance in order to safeguard the interest, convenience, welfare, health, and safety of its constituents by avoiding or reducing commission of crimes within Barangay San Agustin;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY OF SAN AGUSTIN DULY ASSEMBLED IN SESSION;**

**Section 1.** For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms are hereby defined to wit:

- a. **TRANSIENT EMPLOYEES OR WORKERS** – shall refer to individuals who are not residents of Barangay San Agustin, but are hired, employed, or contracted to work in any commercial, industrial or business establishments, including construction projects, within the jurisdiction of Barangay San Agustin. These shall include, but not limited to construction workers, project base employees or workers who are in contract to perform specific jobs or duties within a designated duration of time that requires temporary stay in the place of work.
- b. **WORK CLEARANCE** – shall refer to a document allowing the individual to work within the jurisdiction of Barangay San Agustin.

**Section 2.** All transient employees or workers that are hired, employed, or contracted to work, permanently or temporarily, in Barangay San Agustin are required to register and secure a working clearance;

**Section 3.** Employers who hire or employ a transient employee or worker are likewise required to include working clearance as one of the requirements in hiring employees;

**Section 4.** The following documentary requirements are required to be submitted for the registration and issuance of a Barangay Clearance:

- a. Identification Card issued by the company, firm or establishment where the employee or worker is affiliated or employed. In case an employee or worker is employed in construction project, a letter of introduction/application from the building contractor must be presented;
- b. Application Form to be filed by the applicant, worker / employee;
- c. Two (2) copies of 2" x 2" colored picture of the employee or worker.

**Section 5.** An amount of ONE HUNDRED PESOS (Php 100.00) shall be charged against the applicant for the registration and issuance of a working clearance;

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**Section 6.** The Barangay working clearance shall contain the full name of the employee or worker, his position or job in the company or establishment, his permanent home address , duration of his working contract (inclusive dates), and the name of his company and its address in Barangay San Agustin;

**Section 7.** The working clearance shall be valid for one (1) year upon the date of issue. The working clearance shall be deemed cancelled and rendered null and void upon its expiration;

**Section 8.** The Punong Barangay, shall be the signatory of the working clearance;

**Section 9.** Violation of Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be punishable as follows:

- First Offense: Fine of One Hundred Pesos (Php 100.00);
- Second Offense: Fine of Three Hundred Pesos (Php 300.00);
- Third and Succeeding Offense: Fine of Five Hundred Pesos (Php 500.00).

Violation of Section 3 of this Ordinance, company/business establishments who shall willfully allow a transient employee or worker without working clearance shall be punishable as follows:










- First Offense: Fine of Five Hundred Pesos (Php 500.00);
- Second Offense: Fine of Eight Hundred Pesos (Php 800.00);
- Third Offense: Fine of One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) and none issuance of Barangay Business Clearance.

**Section 10: SEPARABILITY CLAUSE** - If any provision, section or part of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or impair the remaining provisions, section, or parts thereof and shall continue to be in force and effect;

**Section 11:** Upon effectivity, the Punong Barangay, Executive Officer (BPSO) and any officer/agent of the law shall enforce the ordinance.

**Section 12: EFFECTIVITY** – This Ordinance shall take effect upon review and approval of the Quezon City Council.

ORDINANCE NO. 02-S-2016

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING OWNERS/LESSEES/CONTRACTORS OR SUB-CONTRACTORS OF ALL CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATION, DEMOLITION, EXCAVATION AND OTHER CIVIL OR STRUCTURAL PROJECTS WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF BARANGAY SAN AGUSTIN TO POST A MANDATORY CASH BOND DEPOSIT IN THE AMOUNT OF TEN THOUSAND PESOS (Php. 10,000.00) OR ONE (1%) PERCENT OF THE TOTAL PROJECT COST WHICHEVER IS HIGHER.

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 states the "Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessary implied there from, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things, the preservation and enrichment of culture, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balance ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, improve public morals, enhance economic prosperity and social justice, promote full employment among their residents, maintain peace and order and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants."

WHEREAS, after the issuance of Barangay Clearance most owners/lessees/contractors and sub-contractors undertaking construction, renovation, demolition, excavation and other civil or structural projects within the Barangay grossly violate provisions of the Building Code, City Ordinances, Barangay and Homeowners Association regulations deliberately or otherwise;

WHEREAS, to ensure compliance to existing laws, rules and regulations governing construction, demolition, renovation, excavation and other civil or structural projects, the Barangay Council finds it necessary to require the owners/lessees/contractors and sub-contractors of such projects to post a mandatory cash bond deposit for each and every proposed civil and infrastructure activity within the Barangay, be it private or government project;

WHEREAS, the intent of the Barangay Council in enacting this ordinance is to protect the interest, convenience, welfare, health, and safety of its constituents by avoiding or reducing the risk of damages to properties and injuries to persons; by preventing inconveniences of flood due to clogged drainages and waterways, annoyance caused by impassable sidewalks; by averting vehicular accidents, complaints, arguments and misunderstanding of neighbors, and irresponsibility of some contractors and worker undertaking various projects within Barangay San Agustin;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY OF SAN AGUSTIN DULY ASSEMBLED IN SESSION;**

SECTION 1. To require owners/lessees/contractors and sub-contractors of all constructions, renovations, demolitions, excavation and other civil or structural projects within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay San Agustin to post a mandatory cash bond deposit in the amount of TEN THOUSAND PESOS (Php. 10,000.00) or one (1%) percent of the total project cost whichever is higher;

SECTION 2. To impose administrative fines and penalties deductible to the cash bond deposit per commission of violation hereunder prescribed;

SECTION 3. Non-violation to the provisions of Section 2 of this ordinance shall entitle the owner, contractor and sub-contractor to the refund of the cash bond deposit less One Thousand Pesos (Php1,000.00) administrative fee;

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall apply to all construction/renovation/demolition and other civil and structural projects that required Permit from the Quezon City Department of Building Official;

SECTION 5. Minor repair of a residential house that does not require Permit from the QC Building Official shall be exempted from this ordinance;

SECTION 7. Indemnification to victims and /or aggravated parties shall be the responsibility of the owner/contractor and shall not be charged against or be deducted from the cash bond deposit;

SECTION 8. Cash bond deposit shall be refunded after the completion of the project and settlement of indemnity;

SECTION 9. To guarantee full compliance to this ordinance, the Barangay Infrastructure Committee and/or any Barangay Officials/duly designated by the Punong Barangay shall regularly inspect, monitor and supervise all civil work activities within the territorial bounds of the Barangay;


SECTION 10. For the efficient implementation of this Ordinance, the Barangay Infrastructure Committee and the Barangay Appropriations Committee are hereby tasked to create a multi-sectoral committee for the formulations of this ordinance implementing rules and guidelines;


SECTION 11. The fines collected in violation of this ordinance shall be accrued to the general fund of the Barangay and shall be subjected to normal accounting, rules and procedures of the Commission on Audit;

SECTION 12. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the remaining provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable;

SECTION 13. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval by the City Council.




  
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
