**ORDINANCE No. 14, S-2012** 

AN ORDINANCE CREATING BARANGAY SAN ANTONIO DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (BSA-DRRMC) TO ADDRESS CASES OF IMMEDIATE RISK TO LIFE AND HEALTH AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES;

Introduced by Kagawad Arlyn V. Guillermo Co-Introduced by Kagawad. Christopher George P. Angad and was unanimously approved by the members of the Sangguniang Barangay in session assembled

WHEREAS, R.A. No. 10121 otherwise known as the "Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010" provides for the institutionalization of the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management System at the Local Government Level;

WHEREAS, Section 12 of the R.A. No. 10121 provides for the creation of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (LDRRMO) which shall be responsible for setting the direction, development, implementation and coordination of Disaster Risk Management Programs within their territorial jurisdictions;

WHEREAS, Rule 6, Section 6 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of R.A. 10121 provides that the Local Sanggunian concerned shall enact appropriate Ordinance to create the Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office inclusive of its allocation of necessary staffing/personnel and budget;

WHEREAS, the DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-143, dated December 09, 2010, enjoins all Local Authorities to implement R.A. No. 10121;

WHEREAS, the deteriorating condition brought about by Climate Change brings obligatory and instantaneous measures and responses to address unexpected and inevitable situations such as flood, heavy weather conditions/typhoon, earthquake, tsunami, mudslide, landslide and other related calamities;

WHEREAS, Barangay San Antonio is one with the National Government's Framework of Governance that aims to correspond the collaboration of all sectors of society in addressing concerns such as incidents of catastrophe impending the community;

WHEREAS, this enabling ordinance shall institutionalize R.A. 10121 in Barangay San Antonio, Area 2, District 1 Quezon City to address cases of immediate risk to life and health and for other related purposes;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of Barangay San Antonio, Area II, District 1, Quezon City, in regular session assembled that:

SECTION 1. TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known as the "Barangay San Antonio Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committee"

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY

Barangay San Antonio joins the National Government and Quezon City Government in instituting an effective Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Program for better a system of responding to impending and unexpected calamities, disasters and other catastrophic phenomena.

SECTION 3. THE BSA-DRRMC

There shall be established Barangay San Antonio Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committee (BSA-DRRMC) which shall operate under the Office of the Punong Barangay, Ernesto R. Berroya, who shall be responsible for setting the direction, development, implementation and coordination of Disaster Risk Management Programs within the territorial jurisdiction and organizing, training and directly supervising the local emergency response team and the Accredited Community Disaster Volunteers (ACDV).

The BSA-DRRMC shall be included in the standing regular committees of the Barangay.

## SECTION 4. COMPOSITION AND STRUCTURE

The Barangay San Antonio Disaster Risk Reduction and Management office shall be composed of the following;

### SECTION 5. FUNCTIONS OF THE BSA-DRRMC

The Barangay San Antonio Disaster Risk Reduction and Management office shall perform the following functions:

- a. Design the program and coordinate Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Activities consistent with the National Council's standards and guidelines.
- b. Facilitate and support risk assessments and contingency planning activities at the local level;
- Consolidate local disaster risk information which includes natural hazards, vulnerabilities, and climate change risks, and maintain a local risk map.
- d. Organize and conduct training, orientation, and knowledge management activities on Disaster Risk Reduction and Management at the local level;
- e. Operate multi-hazard early warning system linked to Disaster Risk Reduction to provide accurate and timely advice to National or Local Emergency Response Organizations and to the general public, through diverse mass media, particularly radio, landline communications and technologies for communications within the rural community.
- f. Formulate and implement a comprehensive and integrated Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Policy (LDRRMP) in accordance with the National and City framework and policies on Disaster Risk Reduction in close coordination with the Local Development Councils (LDC's)
- g. Conduct continuous disaster monitoring and mobilize instrument and entitles of the LGU's, Civil Society Organizations (CSO's), private groups and organized volunteers to utilize their facilities and resources for the protection and preservation of life and properties during emergencies in accordance with existing policies and procedures.
- h. Identify, assess and manage the hazards, vulnerabilities and risks that may occur in the locality'
- Disseminate information and raise public awareness about those hazards, vulnerabilities and risks, their nature, effects, early warning signs and counter measures;
- Identify and implement cost effective risk reduction measures and strategies.
- Maintain a database of human resources, equipment, directories, and location of critical infrastructures and their capacities such as hospitals and evacuation centers.
- 1. Develop, strengthen and operationalize mechanisms for partnership or networking with the private sector, civil society organizations (CSO's), and volunteer groups.
- m. Take all necessary steps on a continuing basis to maintain, provide, or arrange the provision of or to otherwise make available, suitably trained and competent personnel for effective civil defense and disaster risk reduction and management in Barangay San Antonio.
- n. Organize, train, equip and supervise the Local Emergency Response Team and the Accredited Community Disaster Volunteers (ACDV's) ensuring that humanitarian aid workers are equipped with basic skills to assist mother to breastfeed.
- o. Respond to and manage the adverse effects of emergencies and carry out recovery activities in the affected area, ensuring that there is efficient mechanism for immediate delivery of food, shelter and medical supplies for women and children, endeavor to create a special place where internallydisplaced mothers can find help with breastfeeding, feed and care for their babies and give support to each other;
- p. Within its area, promote and raise public awareness of and compliance with this Ordinance and legislative provisions relevant to the purposes of this Ordinance.
- q. Coordinate other Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Activities.

- r. Establish linkage/network with other LGUs for Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Response purposes;
- s. Recommend through BSA-DRRMC the enactment of Local Ordinances consistent with the requirements of this Ordinance.
- t. Implement policies, approved plans and programs of Barangay San Antonio Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council (BSA-DRRMC) consistent with the policies and guidelines laid down in this Ordinance.
- u. Establish a Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction Management Operations Center;

Prepare and submit, through the (BSA-DRRMC) and the Local Development Council (LDC), the report on the utilization of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund (LDRRMF) and other dedicated Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Resources to the Local Commission on Audit (COA), copy furnished the Regional Director of the Office of the Civil Defense and the Local Government Operations Officer of the DILG and
- w. Act on other matters that may be authorized by Barangay San Antonio Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council (BSA-DRRMC).

## SECTION 6. <u>MEETINGS AND INTERNAL RULES OF BARANGAY SAN ANTONIO DISASTR RISK</u> REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCIL (BSA-DRRMC)

The Barangay San Antonio Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council shall meet on a quarterly basis on dates and place to be determined by the body. The Chairperson of the Council may call for a special meeting as may deemed necessary. The Council shall promulgate its own rules for their meeting. The Chairman shall designate persons to act as the Secretariat of the Council.

#### SECTION 7. LOCAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Barangay San Antonio Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council shall submit Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (LDRRMP) to the Office of the Civil Defense for Review and Evaluation.

SECTION 8. LOCAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT FUND (LDRRMF)

The present Local Calamity Fund shall henceforth be known as the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Funds (LDRRMF). Not less than five (5%) percent of the estimated revenue from regular sources shall be set aside as the LDRRMF to support disaster risk management activities such as, but not limited to, pre-disaster preparedness programs including training purchasing life saving rescue equipment, supplies and medicines for post-disaster activities, and for the payment of premiums of calamity insurance. BSA-DRRMC, shall monitor and evaluate the use and disbursement of the LDRRMF based on the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (LDRRMP) as incorporated in the approved Local Development Plan and Annual Work and Financial Plan. Upon the recommendation of the BSADRRMC and approval of the Sanggunian Panglungsod, the BDRRMC may transfer the said fund to support Disaster Risk Reduction Work of other LDRRRMC which are declared under state of calamity.

Of the amount appropriated for the LDRRMF, thirty (30%) shall be allocated as Quick Response Fund (QRF) or stand-by fund for relief and recovery programs in order that situations and living conditions of people in community areas stricken by disasters, calamities, epidemics, or complex emergencies, may be normalized as quickly as possible.

Unexpended LDRRMF shall accrue to a special trust fund solely for the purpose of supporting Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Activities of the LDRRMC's and within the next five (5) years shall revert back to the general fund and will be available for other social services to be identified by the Sangguniang Panglungsod.

SECTION 9. ACCREDITATION, MOBILIZATION & PROTECTION OF DISASTER VOLUNTEERS

The Barangay may mobilize individuals or organize volunteers to augment our respective personnel complement and logistical requirements in the delivery of Disaster Risk Reduction Programs and Activities and shall submit full responsibility for the enhancement, welfare and protection of volunteers, and shall submit the list of volunteers to the OCD, through the QC Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (QCDRRMO), for accreditation and inclusion in the data base of community volunteers.

Mobilization of volunteers shall be in accordance with the guidelines to be formulated by the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) consistent with the provisions as provided for by the "Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010". Any volunteer who incurs death or injury while engaged in any of the activities defined under Republic Act 10121 shall be entitled to compensatory benefits and individual personnel accident insurance as may be defined under the guidelines.

SECTION 10. COORDINATION DURING EMERGENCY

The Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council which shall take the lead in preparing for, responding to, and recovering from the effects of any disaster within the city will automatically assign its local functions to the:

(a) Barangay Development Council (BDC), if Barangay concerned is affected;

#### SECTION 11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

If for any reason or reasons, any part or provisions of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions thereof which are not affected shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 12. SUPPLEMENTARY CLAUSE

In case of conflict, doubt, or ambiguity in the interpretation of this ordinance, the provisions as provided under Republic Act No. 10121, otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010 and its implementing rules and regulations shall be supplementary.

On matters not provided in this Ordinance, any existing applicable laws and their corresponding implementing rules and regulations, executive orders and relevant issuances issued therefore shall likewise be applied in a supplemental manner.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVITY

This ordinance shall take effect within fifteen (15) days after its approval and the posting of the full text of this ordinance in two (2) conspicuous places of the Barangay. Copies of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the Sangguniang Panglungsod for appropriate action.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE BARANGAY IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM FOR RESIDENTS OF BARANGAY PINAGKAISAHAN, DISTRICT IV, QUEZON CITY

Sponsored by: Kgd. Reynaldo C. Manlulo, Committee Chairman Ways & Means

WHEREAS, under Iocal Government code of 1991, the barangay has the power create laws and to collect reasonable charges;

WHEREAS, the cost of the Barangay ID is separately aside from the cost of the issuance of Barangay Clearance;

WHEREAS, the Barangay ID is computerized and contains necessary information about the applicant with his/her picture in it and signed by the Punong Barangay to certify the validity of the Barangay ID;

WHEREAS, the Barangay ID can be used for reference and for whatever legal purpose it may serve and as proof that whoever possesses it is a bonafide residents of Barangay Pinagkaisahan, District IV, Quezon City;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Barangay Council in session duly assembled, An Ordinance providing for the Barangay Identification System for Residents of Barangay Pinagkaisahan, District IV, Quezon City,

Section 1. The issuance of Barangay Identification card is exclusively for bonafide residents and or registered voters of Barangay Pinagkaisahan.

Section 2. The requirements for the issuance of the Barangay ID are the following:

- a. Valid Barangay Clearance, barangay clearance has a validity of one (1) year.
- b. Only Barangay Residents and registered voters of Barangay Pinagkaisahan are allowed to avail the Barangay ID. Failure to present valid documents of identity must have the endorsement/certification at least (3) members of the Barangay Officials or any of our Barangay Staff to verify the status of his/her residency.
- c. All applicants of Barangay ID should be (18) years old and above and was resided in the barangay for at least (6) months.
- d. The applicants should present at least (1) primary or secondary ID's proving his/her identity.

Section 3. The ID issued by the barangay is valid for one (1) year and subject for renewal. The ID shall be issued upon payment of Fifty pesos (P 50.00). The amount collected shall be used for the expenses incurred in printing and production of the ID.

Section 4. Barangay ID's may be declared invalid as soon as it was proven that the bearer is no longer a resident of the barangay.

WHEREAS, such posters and/or advertising materials serve as eyesores, destroying the original concept of affected areas and are intentionally left behind to prolong the advertisement of their products, services offered and other form of individual interest;

#### NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY OF BARANGAY GREATER LAGRO IN A SESSION DULY ASSMEBLED, upon motion made by Kgwd Dayandante, duly unanimously seconded:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any company, institutions, or individuals to post or place poster and/or advertising materials such as streamers, tarpaulins, and/or tin plates without first securing proper barangay clearances from the Office of the Punong Barangay, in all electrical lamp post, street signs, cables, wires, fences, and trees in all public places within the area of jurisdiction of Barangay Greater Lagro;

SECTION 2. COMMON POSTER AREA - The following places/areas are hereby declared/designated as the Common Poster Areas within the area of jurisdiction of Barangay Greater Lagro, namely;

SECTION 3. DEPUTATION — Devolving the functions and objectives of this Ordinance, the Barangay Purok Leaders of Barangay Greater Lagro are mandated to closely monitor all electric lamp posts, street signs, cables, wires in all public places, trees and/or fences within their area of jurisdiction and report all posters and/or advertisement materials placed/installed/erected/nailed and/or posted thereon to the Punong Barangay. The Barangay Purok Leaders and the SWMU Personnel are hereby deputized to remove, dismantle, and destroy illegally posted posters and/or advertisement materials outside of the authorized common posting areas. Likewise, all Electric, Telephone, Cable and other Utility Companies are hereby authorized to dismantle, remove, and/or destroy illegally installed posters and advertisement materials illegally installed/hanged on utility cables, transmission lines and post/s owned and/or installed by their respective companies within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Greater Lagro.

SECTION 4. PENALTY - Any person caught placing/installing/erecting/nailing and/or posting posters and/or advertisement materials in all electrical lamp posts, street signs, cables, wires in all public places, trees and/or fences, and/or on declared/designated common poster areas without first securing Barangay Clearance from the Office of the Punong Barangay shall pay the amount of not less than P200.00 but not more than P1, 000.00 as fine over and above the usual Barangay Clearance fee; Repeated violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subjected to non-issuance of Barangay Clearance, aside from the removal, dismantle, and destroy of the illegally posted posters and/or advertisement materials, and/or recommendation for the City Business Permit and Licensing office (BPLO) for non-issuance of Business permit,

SECTION 5. REPEALING CLAUSE – All existing Ordinances, resolutions and laws passed by previous Barangay Administration are hereby repealed, revoked or modified accordingly.

SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, sub-section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or unenforceable portion, and to the end that the provisions of this Ordinance are declared severable.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY - This Ordinance taker effect upon it is duly reviewed/confirmed/approved of the Quezon City Council.



WHEREAS, under the General Welfare Clause or Section 16 of Republic Act No.7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, every Local Government Unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied there from, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental of its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdiction. Tocal Government Units shall ensure and support, among other things, xxx, the promotion of health and safety, xxx, xxx, improvement of public morals, xxx, and preservation of the comfort and maintenance of peace and order



WHEREAS, Section 391 of the same Code, the Sangguniang Barangay as the Legislative Body, shall (1) enact Ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred upon it by Laws or Ordinances in order to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants therein.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY OF HOLY SPIRIT, DISTRICT II, QUEZON CITY, IN SESSION ASSEMBLED upon motion duly seconded.

**Section 1. Prohibition.** Owners of internet cafes or computer shops operating within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Holy Spirit are hereby prohibited from allowing high school and elementary students in uniform to play video games in the internet and use its computer service during school days.

Section 2. Exception. The following are the exceptions to the prohibition.

- a) Those students who are in the company of parents or guardians;
- b) Those students who are conducting research for school purposes;

Section 3. Miscellaneous Provision. For purposes of implementing, the herein Ordinance shall be a supplement to all City Ordinances related hereto, particularly Ordinance No. SP-572. S-97, otherwise known as the Quezon City Child and Welfare Ordinance as amended by Ordinance No. SP-1713, S-2006. However, the Punong Barangay may opt to apply also the provisions of the herein Ordinance.

**Section 4**. **Penalties**. In case of violation, the owner or his representative shall be penalized by the following:

a) First Offense

Fine of P500.00

b) Second Offense

Fine of P1,000.00

c) Third Offense

Fine of P1,000.00 and

recommendation for closure

**Section 5. Repealing Clause**. All Barangay Ordinances, Resolutions and Executive Orders or part of parts thereof which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 6. Separability Clause. If, for any reason or reasons, any part of provisions of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof, which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

**Section 7. Effectivity Clause**. This Ordinance shall take effect after confirmation/approval by the Quezon City Council.





# BARANGAY ORDINANCE NO. 13, S-2012

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SPEED LIMIT OF MOTOR VEHICLE TRAVERSING ROOSEVELT AVENUE FROM PAT SENADOR STREET UP TO MANGGA STREET AND VICE VERSA WITHIN THE POLITICAL JURISDICTION OF BARANGAY SAN ANTONIO AND IMPOSING PENALTIES IN VIOLATION THEREOF.

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides the General Welfare Clause which states that every local government unit shall within their respective territorial jurisdiction promote health and safety, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants;

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code of 1991 (R.A. 7160), Book III, Chapter 4, Sec. 391 (No. 1, Empower the Sangguniang Barangay as Legislative Body, to enact ordinances as maybe necessary to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants therein);

WHEREAS, Roosevelt Avenue is a national road which traverses Barangay San Antonio;

WHEREAS, Roosevelt Avenue a major thoroughfare which as a very heavy volumes of vehicle usage;

WHEREAS, the immediate vicinities along side of Roosevelt Avenue are saturated with numerous business establishments and private residences;

WHEREAS, the same area is proximate to a densely populated urban poor communities called the Madrigal Estate;

WHEREAS, numerous vehicular and pedestrian accidents have occurred along Roosevelt Avenue, resulting to loss of life, physical injury and damage to property;

WHEREAS, the safety of both motorist and pedestrian has remain a top priority program of the Barangay Council;

# NOW, THEREFORE,

**BE IT ORDAINED** BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY OF BARANGAY SAN ANTONIO IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. That a speed limit of maximum of fifty (50) kilometers per hour (50/kph) for all types of vehicles traversing along Roosevelt Avenue within the political jurisdiction of Barangay San Antonio shall be enforced.

SECTION 2. That no public utility Tricycle shall be allowed to traverse along Roosevelt Avenue within the political jurisdiction of Barangay San Antonio.

SECTION 3. That the Barangay Public Safety Officer (BPSO) of Barangay San Antonio and duly Deputized Traffic Enforcers in coordination with MMDA, LTO, QCPD, DPOS and other Law Enforcement Agencies are hereby mandated to apprehend violators of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after approval/confirmation by the office concerned.



#### **CBCP STATEMENT ON GAMBLING**

In the past few days some writers and politicians have attacked the integrity and credibility of the Catholic Bishops Conference of the Philippines (CBCP) with regard to gambling. In view of this the CBCP issues the following statement:

We categorically deny that the CBCP as a body has ever solicited or knowingly received funds from illegal gamblers. We express great sorrow if individual religious leaders and/or religious institutions had solicited funds for charitable purposes from public monies gained from legal gambling. But as pastors who deeply care for the poor, we would be the first not to judge their consciences on this matter. For it is most unfortunate that in our situation of poverty today public funds gained from legal gambling are often the only resource for the poor to be assisted adequately. Even if this were so, the CBCP does not encourage this manner of helping the poor. It could easily be construed as approving and promoting the culture of gambling and thereby scandalize the faithful.

To inform the public better about the reasons for this CBCP position, we present the following moral teachings and pastoral imperatives:

- The Catholic Church teaches that "games of chance or wagers are not in themselves contrary
  to justice. They become morally unacceptable when they deprive someone of what is
  necessary to provide for his needs and those of others. The passion for gambling risks
  becoming an enslavement" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2413). This moral
  teaching does not prohibit some forms of gambling in certain situations. In consequence, it
  does not prohibit people or institutions, even church-related ones, from receiving benefits
  from such gambling.
- 2. However, applying the general moral principle to the specific Philippine situation, the CBCP has deemed it necessary to state on several occasions that the form of gambling that is organized, widespread, and systemic, whether legal or illegal, is not desirable. It is creating a culture of gambling that is seriously eroding the moral values of our people. In its illegal form, especially jueteng, gambling has bred a clandestine network of corruption that feeds itself on the hundreds of millions of pesos lost to gambling especially by the poor.
- 3. Therefore, the CBCP has made it a collective policy:
  - o To denounce illegal gambling in all its forms and prevent its legalization;
  - To combat the expansion of organized and systemic legal gambling;
  - To refrain from soliciting or receiving funds from illegal and legal gambling so as not to promote a culture of gambling; and
  - To encourage church personnel and church institutions to refrain from doing the same, even when the objective may be that of helping the poor.

Today the CBCP renews its commitment to combat the growing culture of gambling in our country by faithfully adhering to the policy its members had collectively agreed upon.

#### RADICATE GAMBLING: IT IS MORAL AND SOCIAL CANCER

(A Pastoral Statement on Gambling)

For the past 15 years the Bishops of the Philippines have been denouncing gambling in its various forms, especially *jueteng*.

Whether it is jueteng or masiao or any other form, gambling as systematic, widespread and illegal is truly a moral and social cancer.

It has become an insidious subculture of immense corruption that involves a shadowy network of powerful financiers, protectors, and lords. It destroys moral values such as industry and hard work, accountability and honesty, integrity and justice. Such gambling is never a moral virtue. It is a moral vice that, because of its systematic rampancy, has become entrenched within the psyche of many and within our social system, corrupting these from within.

With the huge sums that they control without any accountability to anyone but themselves, gambling lords can make or unmake political and professional careers by corrupting law enforcement and political processes and the people that run them. The public testimonies of various people involved in gambling have told us of the incredible territorial and personal coverage of jueteng alone and the vast unimaginable amounts of profits gained, astoundingly far higher than the yearly budgets of many municipalities and cities in the country.

Gambling exploits the poor in a particular way. Fleecing the poor of the little they have, some 85% of gambling profits return to the pockets of gambling operators. With their hard-earned money the poor are daily lured by the easy money that gambling vainly promises. Whatever little recreational value it might have cannot justify the immense suffering inflicted on entire families because of the loss of money needed for the basic necessities.

We, therefore, once again strongly denounce systematic, widespread and illegal gambling in whatever form. We strongly denounce any attempt to legalize it. We once again appeal to our political leaders, lawmakers and law enforcers to put teeth to our anti-gambling laws, ferret outrithe gambling lords and their protectors, and punish them with the full force of the law. We encourage and support citizens' movement, such as *Krusadang Bayan Laban sa Jueteng* (Jueteng, Free Philippines), to root out gambling from our culture. With the Blessed Virgin Mary, we pray to the Lord that this moral and social cancer of gambling be finally and decisively excised from our culture.







Chuateco, and the City Homes Inc. (City Homes for brevity) & Golden Haven Construction & Development Corporation (Golden Haven for brevity) over a parcel of land consisting of 15,000 square meters situated in Panama St., Veterans Village, Brgy. Holy Spirit, Quezon City.

For information, I am the owner of this assailed land area, embraced by TCT 8240 in the name of Laureano de Asis, now transferred in my favor, attached hereto copy of TCT 8240 and Deed of Sale, as Annex "A" and Annex "B".

Previously, 5,000 square meters of land area to be developed as Montville Place (Phase I), was already granted approval by your Hon. 

#### Gentlemen:

I respectfully request the City Council to reconsider its approval of the Resolution dated 10 May 2011 of the Special Investigative Committee on Administrative Cases Against Elective Barangay Officials (the "Committee") in Administrative Case No. 168-11 entitled "Edgardo F. Santos vs. Punong Barangay Arturo Halili, only insofar as the City Council approved the recommendation that Punong Barangay Arturo Halili be only reprimanded. I received the letter dated 17 July 2012 from the Office of the City Secretary informing me of the Resolution of the City Council on July 18, 2012.

Considering that the Committee correctly found that Punong Barangay Arturo Halili had illegally installed the no parking signages along the streets of Tolentino, San Vicente and San Pedro Bautista of Barangay Damayan, Quezon City without any lawful authority or valid city parking ordinance allowing the same, the penalty of reprimand is too light and simply a tap on the wrist for such illegal action.

Punong Barangay Halili clearly acted with grave abuse of authority in installing the no parking signages without proper coordination with the Department of Public Order and Safety and in the absence of any city ordinance prohibiting parking along said streets. His actions caused much confusion and problems to the residents and establishments around the area whose businesses were severely prejudiced by the putting up of these signs without any legal basis. This also became the source of harassment of motorists by barangay traffic enforcers.

The very actions of Punong Barangay Halili speak for themselves. Punong Barangay Halili's bad faith is evident when he tried to justify his actions and evade liability by citing an ordinance which is no longer effective. He cannot claim good faith or ignorance. As an elected public official, Punong Barangay Halili is accountable to the people and is expected to observe the highest ethical standards in public service. Further, the presumption that a public official has regularly performed his duties is not applicable in the instant case in view of the undisputed

finding by the Committee that the no parking signages were installed by Punong Barangay Halili without any lawful authority.

To serve as an example so that others who may be similarly situated would desist from committing the same illegal acts as Punong Barangay Halili, I respectfully request that the penalty of reprimand be reconsidered and increased to suspension, if not dismissal.



WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State to promote social justice and free access to courts and quasi-judicial agencies and provide adequate legal assistance;

WHEREAS, in its commitment to its noble mandate of dispensing justice to all, prosecutors of the Office of the City Prosecutor are assigned inquest duties including night and weekend shifts in addition to their present functions to afford the citizens adequate access to the administration of justice;

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. SP-97, S-1993 provides for the increase in the allowance of inquest prosecutors from One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P1,500.00) to Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P2,500.00);

WHEREAS, the present allowance of Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P2,500.00) being given to inquest prosecutors has become insufficient due to inflation and the present economic situation brought about by the unabated rise in the cost of gas and other petroleum products;

WHEREAS, a number of inquest prosecutors have expressed reservations in rendering inquest duties especially during the evening and weekend shifts because of such meager allowance;

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the City government to protect the welfare of the abovementioned inquest prosecutors by increasing their monthly allowance;

WHEREAS, it is within the powers of the Sangguniang Panlungsod to enact an ordinance granting additional allowances to these inquest prosecutors, pursuant to Section 458 (1) of the Local Government Code of 1991, to wit:

SECTION 1. TITLE- This Ordinance shall be known as "An ordinance amending Ordinance No. SP-97, S-93 increasing the incentive allowance of the fifty (50) inquest prosecutors of the Office of the City Prosecutor of Quezon City, from Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P2,500.00) to Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00), to be included in the 2013 Annual Budget.

SECTION 2. COVERAGE- This Ordinance shall cover prosecutors of the Office of the City Prosecutor of Quezon City, Department of Justice, designated as inquest prosecutors. It shall be understood that the number of inquest prosecutors shall not exceed fifty (50) in a given month.

WHEREAS, as provided in the 1987 Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines, the State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, and its Implementing Rules and Regulations, specifically provides that among the powers of the Sangguniang Panlungsod is to establish a scholarship fund for deserving students in schools located within its jurisdiction or for students residing within the City;

WHEREAS, while there are existing scholarship programs in the Office of the City Mayor and private schools and entities, a scholarship program for students who would like to pursue post-graduate studies is yet to be established;

WHEREAS, providing post-graduate scholarships to deserving beneficiaries is consistent with the 2010 City Development Plan to make Quezon City a true Knowledge Industry Capital of the country;

WHEREAS, designing a sustainable educational assistance program is an integral part of the City's anti-poverty integration program since the local government of Quezon City believes that education is the ultimate weapon to fight poverty.

#### NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. TITLE – This ordinance shall be known as "The Quezon City Post-Graduate Scholarship Program"

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY – It is hereby declared the policy of the Local Government of Quezon City to provide the less-fortunate but deserving and qualified students within its territorial jurisdiction to post-graduate education, in order to make its human resources globally competitive.

SECTION 3. OBJECTIVES - This Ordinance shall have the following objectives:

- a. Open opportunities to quality education;
- b. Minimize the number of displaced youth in the City;
- c. Upgrade the literacy of the residents of the City;
- d. Promote activities related to the course taken by the grantee for development, such as trainings, projects and seminars;
- e. To attain the objective of the Quezon City Government in promoting the advancement of science and technology with respect to post graduate education; and
- f. Encourage dual scholarship from Quezon City and the prospective school.

SECTION 4. SCHOLARSHIP SCREENING COMMITTEE (SSC) – There is hereby created a Scholarship Screening Committee (SSC), which shall screen and approve qualified scholars, the qualifications of which shall be prescribed in the implementing rules and regulations hereof.

The SSC shall be composed of five (5) members, namely:

- a. Representative of the Honorable City Mayor as Chairperson
- b. Head of the City Planning and Development Department as member
- c. Head of the Scholarship and Youth Development Program (SYDP) - as member
- d. Head of the City Personnel as member
- e. Chairperson, Committee on Education, as member

SECTION 5. BENEFICIARIES OF THE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM – the following shall be the minimum qualifications of any beneficiary of the Scholarship Program:

- a. The grantee shall be a college graduate who is willing and capable to pursue a post-graduate degree;
- b. The grantee is a graduate from one of the reputable universities of the country as identified by the Commission on Higher Education;
- c. The grantee will only enroll in one of the reputable universities of the country or in an educational institution offering specialized courses as determined by the SSC;

In addition to the above mentioned qualifications, the SSC shall pre-screen the applicant and determine whether he or she meets the requirements set by the SYDP. After pre-screening, the SSC shall identify who will be recommended for nomination for the grant of scholarship.

The SSC screening shall be in two phases, as follows:

First Screening: The first screening shall be conducted through a written examination that will gauge the nominee's analytical and numerical abilities.

Second Screening: The second screening shall be conducted through a technical interview of nominee/s who passed the written examination. The technical interview shall focus on the nominee's research proposal and determine his/her capacity to undergo the rigors of graduate studies.

SECTION 6. LIMITATIONS TO THE GRANTEE – The following shall be the limitations to the availment of the scholarship program:

- a. Only one member of the family can avail of this grant in a school year;
- b. Must be a resident of Quezon City for at least 3 years; and
- c. Grantee must be twenty (20) years old but not more than thirty (30) years old.

SECTION 7. TERMS AND CONDITIONS – Financial assistance to the grantee shall cover one (1) academic year, but he shall renew his application for scholarship every semester until he shall have completed the degree subject to the following conditions:

- a. The courses to be taken shall be approved by the SSC;
- b. The grantee shall immediately enroll in the semester following the approval of his application for scholarship assistance or he may defer the availment provided that SYDP is explicitly informed through a written request;
- c. The grantee shall maintain a weighted average of 1.50 or its equivalent with no failing grade;

d. City Hall employees under this program shall finish the academic course within four (4) years for Masters Degree and at least six (6) years for Doctorate Degree depending on the rules of the University as stipulated in their MAXIMUM Residency Requirement" (MRR). In no case shall the course be finished beyond the prescribed years.

The grantee shall carry minimum semester load prescribed by the school for the particular year level or course which requires thesis for the completion of such course.

e. Non-City Hall employee under this program shall finish the academic program within three (3) years for Masters Degree and five (5) years for Doctorate Degree depending on the rules of the University as stipulated in their "Maximum Residency Requirement (MRR). In no case shall the course be finished beyond the prescribed years.

The grantee shall carry the full semester load prescribed by the school for the particular year level or course which requires thesis for the completion of such course.

- f. The grantee's thesis/dissertation must be for the benefit of the City;
- g. The grantee shall actively participate in community/special projects initiated by the City Government for the duration of his scholarship; and
- h. In case of a government employee, the grantee shall be exclusively employed by the city for two (2) years for each academic school year and cannot sever employment unless he pays back the total amount of the scholarship he gained from the City provided that in no case shall the years of employment exceed five (5) years. In case of a non-government employee, he may be employed or render consultancy services to the City for a reasonable period of time subject to agreement between the City and the grantee.

SECTION 8. GROUNDS FOR TERMINATION OF SCHOLARSHIP — The following shall be the grounds for the termination of the scholarship, unless otherwise provided by the SYDP:

- a. Non-fulfillment of scholarship requirements;
- b. Academic deficiencies;
- c. Forging or falsification of official grades/records;
- d. Abandonment of scholarship and/or non-communication with SYDP office for one semester despite the efforts exerted by the latter to communicate; and
- e. Conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude
- f. Other causes as may be determined by the SYDP

In case the grantee's general weighted average falls below the required minimum to avail of the scholarship, the beneficiary shall be given another opportunity to meet the required general weighted average. However, a failing, dropped or incomplete mark in any subject will automatically terminate the scholarship.

Likewise, any grantee who fails to fulfill or terminates the scholarship for any reason, must reimburse the City Government the total amount of the scholarship, within (2) years after the termination of the scholarship.

SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION – An initial amount of Three Million Five Hundred Thousand Pesos (P 3,500,000.00) shall be allotted which shall be taken from the budget of Scholarship for Youth and Development Program (SYDP) for the year 2012. Thereafter, an annual budget shall be allocated for its continuous operation.

SECTION 10. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS - The SYDP shall issue guidelines and prescribe the appropriate rules and regulations for the implementation of this ordinance, taking into account those already issued by CHED and the Civil Service Commission.



#### PROPOSED ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING MEDICINE ALLOWANCE, HOSPITALIZATION ASSISTANCE AND DEATH BENEFIT TO SENIOR CITIZENS OF QUEZON CITY.

#### Introduced by Councilor ALEXIS R. HERRERA

WHEREAS, the Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010 enjoined the Department of Health, local government units and other concerned organizations to institute a national health program for the elderly;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government recognizes the contribution made by senior citizens in the development of Quezon City;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9257 entitle: An Act Granting Additional Benefits and Privileges to Senior Citizens, Amending for the Purpose Republic Act No. 7432, otherwise known as "An Act to Maximize the Contribution of Senior Citizens to Nation Building, Grant Benefits and Special Privileges and for other Purposes" provides, among others, for the following:

- To give full support to the improvement of the total well-being of the elderly and their full participation in society considering that senior citizens are integral part of the Philippine society;
- To provide a comprehensive health care and rehabilitation system for disabled senior citizens to foster their capacity to attain a more meaningful and productive ageing;

WHEREAS, a great number of senior citizens in Quezon City need financial assistance for their medicines, vitamins, and sustenance as well as hospital expenses;

#### NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

Section 1. Senior Citizens are those whose age is at least sixty (60) years of age, a bonafide holder of an OSCA-OC (Office for the Senior Citizens Affairs — Quezon City) ID and registered as a resident in any barangay of Quezon City for at least one (1) year from date of the approval of this Ordinance;

Section 2. Senior Citizens are hereby granted quarterly a medicine allowance in the amount of Six Hundred Pesos (P600.00);

- Section 3. Senior Citizens are hereby granted a Hospitalization Assistance in the amount of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) in cases of hospital confinement which can only be availed of once a year by the qualified senior citizens;
- Section 4. The quarterly medicine allowance provided for under this Ordinance shall be avail of by senior citizens for a period of one (1) year provided that they can present and submit official receipts for medicines, vitamins and supplements purchased under their names. The date of the receipts must be within the quarter being applied for by the senior citizen;
- Section 5. The Hospitalization Assistance shall be applied to the hospital bill and/or medicines as shown in the receipts of the hospitalized senior citizen, after first deducting the PHILHEALTH, SSS, GSIS, MEDICAL INSURANCE and/or other government benefits;
- Section 6. Medical expenses of senior citizens as out-patients, consultations fees, and other laboratory test expenses not conducted during confinement shall not be covered by the hospitalization assistance;
- Section 7. In case of death, the immediate family of a senior citizen shall be entitled to a death benefit of Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00);
- Section 8. Only the qualified senior citizen is entitled to claim the benefits granted under this Ordinance, unless it can be shown that the senior citizen is incapacitated to personally receive the money due to illness or mental condition or in case of death. In which case, his or her spouse or any of his/her children shall receive the monetary benefit;
- Section 9. To qualify, the Senior Citizens must apply before the Screening Committee created by the OSCA to determine the qualifications of the applicants as stated in Section 1 hereof;
- Section 10. Funds for medical assistance and death benefit granted under this Ordinance shall be appropriated annually under the annual budget of the Office of the Senior Citizen Affairs;
- Section 11. The Office of the Mayor shall issue and Implementing Rules and Regulations for the proper implementation of this Ordinance;







RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND HONORING MR. JESUS OLOROSA RAMOS, ALSO KNOWN AS DIRECTOR JESSE RAMOS, A CITIZEN OF QUEZON CITY, FOR BEING THE FIRST FILIPINO INTERNATIONAL DOCUMENTARY FILM MAKER AND PIONEER IN DOCUMENTARY FILM MAKING IN THE PHILIPPINES

#### Introduced by: Councilor ALFREDO D. VARGAS III

WHEREAS, Mr. Jesus Oloroso Ramos, a multi-awarded director also known as Director Jesse O. Ramos of Quezon City, was recognized as the pioneer in documentary and other short film productions in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, his fields of specialization include Radio, Stage, Television and Motion Picture Actor/Writer/Director and Productions; Documentary and Educational, Informational Short Film Productions; Public Relations and Mass Communications; Advertising Services; and, International Trade, Liasion and Promotions;

WHEREAS, Director Ramos has been recognized worldwide for his works and he has developed and proved his skills and knowledge in producing short and documentary films in various countries from 1956 to 1993 for his residencies such as Vietnam, Laos, Singapore, Hong Kong, Thailand, Sri Lanka, India, and the United States of America;

WHEREAS, some of the documentaries made by Director Ramos include:

- -Hundred Caravans Per Hectare (1953) on the life and ways of agricultural workers in the Philippines
- -Better Hides and Skins (1954) a training film created for the Philippine Bureau of the Animal Industry which was sponsored by the United Nation's Food and Agricultural Organization
- -The Grey Menace (1955) a film on rat infestation produced for the Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources
  - -The Fisherman's Bounty (1955) on the conditions of the Philippine fishing industry
- -The Journey (1956) about the Chinese refugees escaping to Laos produced by United States Information Service (USIS), Mopix in Vientiane, Laos
- -The Boat People (1960) portrayed the fishing scheme and life of the so-called boat people in Hong Kong
- -Mangandingay, A Place of Happiness (1964) depicted the efforts of the Philippine Rural Reconstruction Movement in inspiring a community of rural folk with the spirit of working together
- -Reach Out (1968) a training film produced for the Philippine Department of Social Workd and sponsored by UNICEF on the "Social Work Techniques and Art of Interviewing"

-Joselito (1973) – the first film produced by United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) on nutrition in the island of Opon, Cebu, Philippines;

WHEREAS, he has won several international documentary film awards and recognitions inside and outside the country for his distinguished works. Director Ramos was one of the two Asians from South East Asia chosen by the Shell Film Unit, the pioneer in film making from London, to join the Shell Film Unit, where he researched, wrote and directed the documentary film Mandingay, A Place for Happiness in 1964. The film garnered five international awards namely, The Rotary International Award (1964), Cidalc d'Prix Medal Award (1964), British Industrial Film Association National Award (1965), Silver Carabao Award (1964) and FAMAS Special Award (1964). The director was also given a Certificate of Merit by the Film Society of the Philippines in 1964 for his outstanding contributions to the short film movement in the country;

WHEREAS, one of his contributions to the film industry is the introduction of film dubbings in the Philippines that were distributed locally and internationally. He also directed films that were produced by international organizations. In 1956, in close collaboration with the USIS Public Affairs Office Director Mr. Hank Miller, he coordinated and directed the film coverage of the first democratic general elections in the Royal Kingdom of Laos for the United States Information Service (USIS). In 1968, he produced an International Portable Photo-Art "Exhibit on Productivity" for the 13 nation-Asian Productivity Organization (A.P.O.) which was later viewed in Jakarta, Indonesia by the then visiting US President Richard Nixon;

WHEREAS, Director Ramos joined various reputable organizations such as the Actors Guild of the Philippines (1987-1993), Directors Guild of the Philippines (1988-1989), National Press Club (1988-1990), Filipino Specialized Film Makers Foundation of the Philippine Film Academy (1990-1991), Kiwanis Club of Sri Lanka (1987), and International Documentary Association-Los Angeles, California, USA (1987). He was also a founding member of the Film Society of the Philippines in 1955 and became an active member until 1980;

WHEREAS, Director Ramos is a resident of Quezon City, residing in Brgy. North Fairview, Quezon City;

AN ORDINANCE NAMING ALL STREETS WITHIN THE QUEZON CITY HALL COMPOUND AFTER FORMER MAYORS, VICE-MAYORS, CITY COUNCILORS AND PROMINENT PERSONS WHO HAD PASSED AWAY AND SIGNIFICANTLY CONTRIBUTED TO THE WELFARE OF THE FILIPINO PEOPLE.

Introduced by Councilors RICARDO T. BELMONTE, JR., FRANCISCO A. CALALAY, JR., PRECIOUS H. CASTELO, EUFEMIO C. LAGUMBAY, JESUS MANUEL C. SUNTAY

WHEREAS, the 12 hectare Quezon City Hall Compound consists of Fourteen (14) streets which are still unnamed up to the present except the Makatarungan Street located at the rear portion of the Compound from PLDT East Avenue to Health Department Kalayaan Avenue;

WHEREAS, for the convenience of the public who have day to day transactions with the City Government and other offices therein, there is a need to name the said streets to properly locate all offices and buildings within the City Hall Compound;

WHEREAS, the "Local Government Code (RA7160), Sec 13 (d) states: "None of the foregoing local government units, institutions, places or buildings shall be named after a living person, nor may change a name be made unless for justifiable reason and in any case, not oftener than once every ten (10) years..."

WHEREAS, since the Makatarungan Street is within the 12-hectare City Hall Compound, the said street name must be change to a person to be stated hereunder;

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. SP-1951, S-2009 was approved naming the streets inside the City Hall Complex to former Mayors of Quezon City, however, said ordinance is applicable only to six (6) streets for six (6) City Mayors who had passed away.

#### NOW, THEREFORE,

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. Street Names. The streets within the Quezon City Hall Compound shall be named after persons who had passed away consisting of the six (6) mayors, three (3) vice-mayors, two (2) city councilors and three (3) prominent persons with significant contributions to welfare of Filipino people wit:

- MANUEL L. QUEZON: Public Service record: President of the Philippines;
   Founder of Quezon City; Act as mayor at transition period from October 12, 1939 to November 4, 1939.
- 2. TOMAS MORATO: City Mayor from November 10, 1939 to July 19, 1942.
- 3. PONCIANO BERNARDO: City Mayor from 1947 to 1949 Died on April 29, 1949

- 4. NICANOR ROXAS: City Mayor from 1949 to 1950
- 5. IGNACIO S. DLAZ: City Mayor from 1950 to 1953
- NORBERTO AMORANTO: City Mayor from 1954 to 1976
- 7. CARLOS ALBERT: Vice Mayor from 1972 to 1975

- **SECTION 3.** Change of name of Makatarungan St. The Makatarungan St. being within the Quezon City Hall Compound will be changed and named to Ponciano Bernardo St.
- **SECTION 4.** Streets with Permanent Status. Streets named after the mayors who had passed away inclusive of Alejandro Roces shall not be changed, renamed or replaced.
- SECTION 5. Restriction on Betty Go Belmonte Street. The Betty Go Belmonte St. can only be renamed or replaced exclusively by Mayor Feliciano R. Belmonte, Jr. in the future.
- **SECTION 6.** Future changing of Street names. All streets not covered by the provisions of Section 4 and 5 may be subjected to change of street names provided that the name to be replaced shall be a mayor of Quezon City who had passed away.
- **SECTION 7.** Augmentation to Ordinance No. SP-1951, S-2009. This Ordinance augments ordinance SP-1951, 2009 in naming the streets in Quezon City Hall Complex.
- **SECTION 8.** This Ordinance shall be transmitted to the National Historical Institute (NHI) for its conformity prior to installation of approved street names within the City Hall Complex pursuant to Section 13 of the Local Government Code (RA 7160).

**SECTION 9.** Effectivity. This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.


