ORDINANCE Numbered 10.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE PERSONS NAMED IN SECTION 12-c OF THE CHARTER OF QUEZON CITY, THE ISSUANCE OF LICENSES AND PERMITS THEREFOR, AND THE FILING OF THE CORRESPONDING LICENSE AND PERMIT FEES.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Quezon City:

PART I

LICENSES IN GENERAL

SECTION 1. License requirement.- It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct or engage in any business, trade, or profession or calling, or have in his possession any of the articles required by this ordinance to be licensed, without first having obtained the license so required.

SEC. 2. Issuance of license.- Each and every license authorized and required by this ordinance, shall be granted and issued, from time to time, to such person or persons as may be entitled thereto by the City Treasurer upon payment in advance to him, without demand, of the license fee by this ordinance provided to be paid for such license, for the entire period during which said license is to run, and not otherwise.

SEC. 3. Record of licenses issued.- The City Treasurer shall keep a record of all licenses issued by him.

SEC. 4. Applications for licenses; false statements.- Written applications, on forms prepared for that purpose, must be made to the City Treasurer for all licenses provided for in this ordinance. Said applications shall set forth the name and residence of the applicant, a full description of the business, the place where same is to be conducted, and such other information as may be required by the City Treasurer. If a person applying for a license shall make any false statement in regard to his business, with intent thereby to procure a license at less rates than those provided for, he may be prosecuted therefor, and, in addition, his license may be revoked. *See Section 8*

SEC. 5. Publication of applications for license.- Whenever in the judgment of the Mayor such act is deemed advisable, he may provide that before the application for any license shall be received by the City Treasurer, the applicant or applicants shall be required to publish, at his or their own expense, a notice in six consecutive editions of one Spanish and one English newspaper to be designated by the Mayor. Such notice shall be in such form as the Mayor may determine, and shall set:

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forth the fact that on a certain date it is proposed by such applicant or applicants to make applications to the City Treasurer for a license to engage in a certain mentioned business in a building situated on a specific street and at a specified manner. Such notice shall be signed by the applicant or applicants and copies of the newspaper advertisements bearing the dates published shall be filed with the application.

SEC. 6. Date when applications should be submitted.- All applications for business license shall be filed with the office of the City Treasurer fifteen days before the date on which the license should be issued for the first time, and in the case of renewal of applications of such business license, fifteen days before the expiration of the same.

SEC. 7. Payments.- All payments for business licenses shall be made in the Office of the City Treasurer before the taxpayer begins to pursue his industry or enjoy his privileges, and in the case of renewal of said licenses, the payments should be made within the period of ten days prior to their expiration.

✓ SEC. 8. Fines in certain cases. ✓ - Any person who fails to file his application for license or to renew said license within the period prescribed by Section 6 hereof shall pay a fine consisting of ten per centum of the annual or quarterly fee last paid, and in no case greater than fifty pesos nor less than one peso. A fine of ten per centum of the annual or quarterly fee due, and in no case greater than fifty pesos nor less than one peso, shall be imposed upon any person who fails to pay for his license or fails to renew said license within the period prescribed by Section 7 hereof.

SEC. 9. Compromises.- The City Treasurer is hereby authorized, at the option of the taxpayer, to compromise the case by the payment of the fine imposed by the next preceding section, and such fine may be reduced to an amount not less than one peso at the discretion of the City Treasurer according to the circumstances of the case, if payment thereof is made within ten days after delinquency.

SEC. 10. Accounting for collections.- All money collected by virtue of this ordinance shall be accounted for in accordance with the provisions of Section 24 of Commonwealth Act No. 502 and credited to the General Fund of Quezon City.

SEC. 11. Terms.- No license for the businesses enumerated under this ordinance shall be granted for a period of more than one year nor for less than a quarter of a year; and all licenses issued under the terms thereof shall run from the date of their issuance and continue for the period as herein provided and shall expire at the end of the quarter, semester, or year as in each class of business is herein provided. The end of a quarter shall be understood to

be the last days of March, June, September, and December. The end of the semester shall be understood to be the last days of June and December. The last day of a year shall be deemed to be the thirty-first day of December. Nothing contained in this section shall be construed as prohibiting the City Treasurer from collecting the corresponding license fees quarterly; Provided, however, that the fees to be thus collected shall not be less than those which correspond to a quarter.

SEC. 12. Contents.- Every license issued in accordance with this ordinance shall designate the number and kind of license, the date of issue and expiration, the name and residence of the licensee, and a sufficient description of the business and the place where the same is to be carried on. It shall also contain suitable excerpts from this ordinance relating to posting, renewal, transfer, and revocation of such licenses.

SEC. 13. Separate licenses for different businesses and locations.- No person shall conduct more than one kind of business requiring a license or conduct business at more than one place during the term of the license, without obtaining a separate license for each business and place of business so licensed. All licenses shall be strictly limited to the time, place, and person or thing named therein.

SEC. 14. Licenses refused, to whom.- Licenses may be refused to any person who has violated any ordinance or regulation relating to a license privileges granted. A license shall not be granted to any person who has failed to pay, upon demand, the fee for a business privileges conducted and not licensed, or fails to pay any fine, penalty, tax, or other debt or liability to the city or National Government, and if so granted, the license may be revoked upon discovery of such indebtedness.

SEC. 15. Licenses refused, fire escapes.- A license shall not be granted to any person to conduct the businesses of running hotel, lodging house, factory, workshop, hospital, assylum, schoolhouse, accessoria, assembly hall, or office building, until the buildings where such businesses are conducted have been provided and equipped with a sufficient number of fire escapes and other safety appliances which may be required by other ordinances of Quezon City. It shall be the duty of the City Treasurer to refer all applications for new license or applications for a change in the nature of the business to be conducted in buildings described herein to the City Engineer for examination as to the number and location of fire escapes provided for said buildings before the license shall be issued.

SEC. 16. Posting; surrender.- Every person holding a license shall keep it posted at all times while in force in a conspicuous position in the place where

the business is carried on. He shall produce and surrender the license when revoked, or when same has expired, when applying for a renewal or transfer, and when requested so to do by any officer thereunto authorized.

SEC. 17. Duplicate license.- The City Treasurer may, upon proof satisfactory to him that the original has been lost, stolen, or destroyed, issue a duplicate license, at his discretion, upon payment to him of a fee of fifty centavos.

SEC. 18. Transfers.- No license shall be assigned or transferred from one person to another, or authorized any other business or authorized the business to be conducted at any other place than that made in the original, except upon written authority of the City Treasurer who is authorized to transfer license from one person to another, or from one place to another, upon payment to him of a fee of one peso. No transfer shall be made which involves the addition of privileges. In case of transfers, as in this section provided, the old license shall be surrendered and a new one given in its place for the unexpired term of said old license, and said new license shall be subject to all the regulations and requirements as applied to the former.

SEC. 19. Expiration; renewal.- Every license shall cease to be in force upon the expiration of the term thereof, or upon its revocation, and it shall be unlawful for any person holding such license to conduct or to continue any business, trade, or profession so licensed without renewing said license.

SEC. 20. Rebates.- Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this ordinance, no licensee shall be entitled to any rebate, repayment, or refund of the sum paid for any license, or any part thereof, by reason of discontinuance, abandonment, or change of business, trade, occupation, or callings so licensed, or the revocation or suspension of the said license, or other terms of the same before the due expiration thereof.

SEC. 21. Factory requirements.- No license issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall be construed as relieving the person or persons to whom it is issued, or any business, occupation, premises, house, store, tienda, or other place affected by it, from any requirement imposed by the health ordinances of the City.

SEC. 22. Penalties.- Any person licensed under this ordinance who shall violate any of its provisions shall be liable to be proceeded against for the fine or penalty imposed hereby, and the license may be revoked. But the conviction and punishment of any person for transacting any business enumerated in this ordinance without a license shall not excuse or exempt such person from the payment of any license fee or tax or any fine due and unpaid at the time of such conviction.

PART II

PERMITS GENERALLY

SEC. 23. Permits necessary.- It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct or engage in any business, trade, profession, or calling, or have in his possession any of the articles for which a permit is required to be had, without first having obtained such permit in the manner in this ordinance provided.

SEC. 24. Applications, issuance, terms, and renewals.- Permits shall be applied for, granted, and issued in the manner provided for the application for, granting, and issuance of licenses, and in all cases shall run for the period of one year from the date of issue. Permits may be renewed in the same manner as renewals of licenses.

SEC. 25. Record.- The City Treasurer shall keep a record of all permits issued by him.

SEC. 26. Contents; limitations.- Every permit issued in accordance with this ordinance shall designate the number of said permit, the date of issue and expiration, the name and residence of the person or persons to whom issued, and a sufficient description of the business and the place where same is to be carried on. No person shall conduct more than one kind of business requiring a permit, or conduct business at more than one place during the term of the permit, without obtaining a separate permit for each such business and place of business so conducted. All permits shall be strictly limited to the time, place, and person or thing named therein. No permit shall be transferable or assignable.

SEC. 27. Duplicate permits.- The City Treasurer may, upon proof satisfactory to him that the original has been lost, stolen, or destroyed issue a duplicate permit, at his discretion, upon payment to him of a fee of fifty centavos.

SEC. 28. Expiration; renewal.- Every permit shall cease to be in force upon the expiration of the term thereof, or upon revocation of said permit for any of the causes mentioned in this ordinance, and it shall be unlawful for any person holding such permit to conduct or continue the business, trade, profession, or calling so permitted without renewing said permit.

SEC. 29. Posting; surrender.- Permits shall be posted in the same manner as licenses are required to be posted. It shall be produced and surrendered when revoked, or when same has expired shall be produced or surrendered to any officer thereunto authorized.

SEC. 30. Penalties.- Any person to whom a permit has been issued under this ordinance who shall violate any of its provisions shall be liable to be proceeded against for the fine or penalty imposed by this Ordinance, and the permit may be revoked.

SEC. 31. Schedule of Licenses and Permit Fees. -
The following shall be the license and permit fees to be collectible from persons or business establishments within the jurisdiction of Quezon City.
