ORDINANCE Numbered 63

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE GAME OF PANGUINGUE,
CUAJO OR CHINESE PANGUINGUE IN QUEZON CITY.

Be it enacted by the City Council of Quezon
City:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to play for money or other thing representing value, the game of cards commonly known as panguingue, cuajo or chinese panguingue at any time except on Sundays and official holidays, between the hours of eight antemeridian and twelve postmeridian; Provided, however, That the City Mayor may, upon prior application therefor, authorize the playing of such games on ordinary days, which authority shall specify the date and time during which such games shall be played.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to have charge or control of any building, house, or structure, or any part thereof who permits any of said games to take place therein.

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not exceeding P100.00 or imprisonment of not more than 2 months, or by both in the discretion of the court.
