ORDINANCE Numbered 105

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF P3,584.00 OUT OF THE UNAPPROPRIATED FUNDS OF QUEZON CITY TO COVER THE EXPENSES FOR THE OPENING OF ONE GRADE V AND ONE GRADE VI CLASSES IN LA LOMA, QUEZON CITY, FOR A PERIOD OF EIGHT MONTHS FROM OCTOBER, 1940.

WHENBACH, the District Supervisor of Mezoa City Schools, in his letter of October 21, 1940, informed the City Council that in view of the order of the Division Superintendent of City Schools in Manila, no less than 31 pupils in Grade V and 40 pupils in Grade VI enrolled in the schools of said city, who are residents of Quezon City, will have to be dropped at the end of the first semester (October, 1940);

WHEREAS, in order to accommodate these pupils there is need for the opening of one Grade V and one Grade VI classes which he recommends should be at the La Loma Elementary School;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of Quezon City, that:

Section 1. The sum of P3,584.00 is hereby appropriated out of the unappropriated funds of Quezon City for the following purposes:

For salaries of three teachers (1 home-economics teacher, 1 industrial teacher, and 1 academic teacher) at P50 each per month, for eight months	P1,200.00
For supplies and materials	400.00
Govt. Insurance Premium	36.00
Rentals of buildings	500.00
Other services	50.00
Two sets of supplementary readers	81.00
	P2,366.00
For furniture and equipment (Desks, teachers' tables, chairs and book-cases, hysoplates)	729.00
Tools for garden and shop	193.00
Home-economics and miscellaneous equipment	264.00
TOTAL	<u>P3,584.00</u>

Section 2. The amount set aside in this Ordinance shall be spent solely for the purposes herein specified and for no other.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
