ORDINANCE NO. SP-251, S-94

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE QUEZON CITY SPORTS DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL, DEFINING ITS POWERS AND FUNCTIONS, DETERMINING ITS COMPOSITION, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR.

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WHEREAS, there is a need to provide opportunities,  
within the national tradition for practicing sports  
towards the development of physical fitness and the  
attainment of a level of achievement which corresponds  
to the individual's talents;

WHEREAS, statistics reveal that many young people  
are commonly involved in the rising tide of criminality,  
drug addiction, alcoholism and similar vices;

WHEREAS, there is a need to initiate programs  
which would redirect these young people's idleness,  
rechannel their interest and transform them into useful  
and productive citizens;

WHEREAS, a comprehensive sports program under a  
competent office could be the crucial which shall  
initiate, conduct and coordinate sports activities in  
the City which would produce and further develop  
athletes for future competitions, both local and  
international;

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NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY  
IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:



SECTION 1. Title. - This Ordinance shall be known  
as "The Quezon City Sports Development Council  
Ordinance."

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is the  
policy of the State to promote physical education and  
encourage sports, league competitions, and amateur  
sports, including training for international  
competitions, foster self-discipline, teamwork, and  
excellence for the development of a healthy and alert  
citizenry.

SECTION 3. Creation of the Quezon City Sports  
Development Council. - The Quezon City Sports  
Development Council (hereinafter referred to as the SDC)  
is hereby created and established to carry out the  
abovementioned policy and to conceptualize and implement  
the Comprehensive Sports Development Program of the  
Quezon City Government.

SECTION 4. Nature of the SDC. - The SDC shall be  
the sole policy-making and coordinating body of all  
sports development programs in the City.

SECTION 5. Functions and Powers of the SDC. The  
SDC shall have the following functions:

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- (a) Plan and supervise an integrated sports  
promotion and development program in  
the grassroots level and to monitor and  
ensure that the concerned offices/units  
organized by the SDC implement their  
respective sports programs for the City  
in coordination with the Department of  
Education, Culture and Sports, the  
Philippine Sports Commission, the  
Philippine Olympic Committee, the  
Amoranto Sports Complex, the barangays  
and other sports organizations, private  
persons and entities;
  - (b) Review and evaluate sports programs  
conducted by all departments involved  
in sports development programs for the  
City;
  - (c) Develop and promulgate rules and regu-  
lations to implement this Ordinance,
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including rules to delineate and define areas of responsibilities of all sectors involved in sports promotion and development;


- (d) Exercise such other acts as are incidents to or are appropriate and necessary in connection with the creation of the SDC.

SECTION 6. Composition of the SDC. - The SDC shall be composed of the following, who will receive no extra emoluments:

- (a) Chairman - City Mayor or his duly designated representative;
- (b) Vice-Chairman - City Vice-Mayor;
- (c) Members -
- c.1 Chairman of the Committee on Youth and Sports Development of the City Council;
- c.2 A Councilor from each district of Quezon City to be elected from among themselves;
- c.3 The Chairman of the Office of the Senior Citizen Affairs;
- c.4 Director of the SDC;
- c.5 Outstanding Sports Leader;
- c.6 Technical Consultant to the SDC;  
and
- c.7 Chairman of the Committee on Barangay Affairs.

Provided, that the Outstanding Sports Leader and the Technical Consultant are to be selected by the regular members of the SDC and entitled to honoraria as determined by the SDC.

SECTION 7. Creation of the Quezon City Sports Development Office. - The Quezon City Sports Development Office (hereinafter referred to as the SDO) is hereby created to be the sole implementing body of the Comprehensive Sports Development Program and shall be under the direct control and supervision of the Office of the City Mayor with the following plantilla positions and corresponding compensation:

SECTION 8. Duties and Functions of the SDO. - The SDO shall:

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- (a) Submit to the SDC the Comprehensive Sports Development Program;
  - (b) Implement the Comprehensive Sports Development Program;
  - (c) Prepare an annual budget for the sports program;
  - (d) Provide technical assistance in terms of training workshops/clinics, mental and spiritual seminars, operational development schemes and the like;
  - (e) Provide administrative support, documentation, promotion, coordination and other assistance that may be required by the SDO; and
  - (f) Submit to the Office of the City Mayor and the SDC an annual report of its accomplishments.

SECTION 9. Personnel Resources. - The SDO shall avail of the expertise and personnel services of a Sports Physician, a Spiritual and a Mental Adviser aside from the administrative and operations staff necessary to the efficient and effective delivery of assistance and other services as may be required by the SDO.

SECTION 10. Sports offered by the SDO. - The SDO shall concentrate on, but not be limited to, selected sports events such as taekwando, swimming, shooting, boxing, track and field, karatedo, judo, fencing, gymnastics, volleyball, lawn tennis, table tennis, and ethnic sports.



SECTION 11. Appointment of the Quezon City Sports Development Office in lieu of the SDO. - The Quezon City Sports Development Office created under an Executive Order of the Office of the Mayor shall carry out the duties and functions of the SDO until such time as the SDO has been established.

SECTION 12. Funding. - The SDO shall be given a funding in the amount of Twenty-Four Million Eight Hundred Ninety-Six Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-Six Pesos (P24,896,456.00) broken down as follows:

Personal Services	P10,396,456.00
Maintenance and Other	
Operating Expenses	7,000,000.00
Capital Outlay	7,500,000.00

Provided, that the said amount be included in the 1994 Annual General Fund Budget of the Quezon City Government, and the succeeding years thereafter.


SECTION 13. Management of the Amoranto Sports Complex. - The administration and management of the Amoranto Sports Complex is hereby transferred to the SDO; Provided, that the SDO can generate funds exclusively for the maintenance and upgrading of the Complex and procurement of equipment vital and necessary for the success of the Comprehensive Sports Program. Provided, further, that all fees, charges, and collectibles shall be remitted to the City Treasury to form a special fund to be used exclusively for the Complex.

SECTION 14. Effectivity. - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.


