ORDINANCE NO. SP-11678-2002

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING MINIMAL RATES OF FEES OF VARIOUS RECREATIONAL FACILITIES OF THE AMORANTO SPORTS COMPLEX AS EMBODIED IN ARTICLE 52, SECTION 204 OF THE QUEZON CITY REVENUE CODE.

WHEREAS, Section 458 (a), Republic Act 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that the sangguniang panlungsed, as the legislative body of the city, shall enact ordinances, approve resolutions and appropriate funds for the general welfare of the city and its inhabitants;

WHEREAS, Section 458 (a) (2), of the said Code further provides that "The sangguniang panlungsod shall generate and maximize the use of resources and revenues for the development plans, program objectives and priorities of the city, xxx and relative thereto shall, (ii) Subject to the provisions of Book II of this Code and applicable laws and upon majority vote of all the members of the sangguniang panlungsod, enact ordinances levying taxes, fees and charges, prescribing the rates thereof for general and specific purposes xxx;"

WHEREAS, the Amoranto Sports Complex serves as one of the most important sports centers in this City which caters to the recreational and sporting needs of the people in our City, as well as those of the neighboring cities and municipalities;

WHEREAS, considering the above premises, it is but only right and justified that those who are benefited by the wholesome atmosphere of the Sports Complex be made to contribute a minimal amount for its maintenance and stability.

NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY I SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. The City Government hereby prescribes the rates of fees for the various sports facilities in the Amoranto Sports Complex, as follows:

SECTION 2. The following are exempt from payment of entrance fees:

a) Children and students below eighteen (18) years of age upon proof ad presentation of school identification cards (ID);

b) Public elementary and secondary school teachers and officials of

Sangguniang Kabataan (SK);

- c) Individual and sports team or groups who have made schedule or reservation and paid exclusive amount for the use of the specified facility such as the swimming pool, basketball court, tennis, etc.;
- d) Commercial entities, organizations, associations or educational institutions who have entered into a special arrangement and paid fees and charges for the exclusive use of the premises and facilities of the sports complex as venues for sports competition and tournaments, charitable purposes or for other lawful use:
- e) Athletics, whether local or foreign, sponsored by government spons organization who would use the facilities of the sports complex for training preparation for national or regional competitions.
- Employees of the Quezon City Government using the SECTION 3. facilities exclusively for official purposes are hereby exempt from paying the herein prescribed fees.
- SECTION 4. An official receipt shall be issued by the administration for any amount collected for the use of any of the facilities of the sports complex.
- SECTION 5. All proceeds from the Amoranto Sports Complex shall rever and accrue exclusively to the maintenance and development fund of the sport complex.
- SECTION 6. The administration of the Sports Complex shall maintain book of accounts which shall be under the charge and supervision of it accountant/treasurer. The book of accounts shall be subject to periodic auditia by the City Treasurer or by his duly authorized representative. accomplishment and financial report shall, likewise, be prepared and submitted a the end of each calendar year to the City Mayor and the City Treasurer.
- SECTION 7. An inventory of all the property owned by the complex, all disbursements made and proceeds earned shall be made by the sports complex administration on or before the end of each calendar year to be evaluated by the City Treasurer.

SECTION 8. The administration of the Sports Complex in coordination with the City Treasurer is hereby tasked to formulate such rules and regulations necessary for the effective implementation of the ordinance.

SECTION 9. If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the Ordinance or the provisions not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

SECTION 10.

This ordinance shall take effect upon approval.
