NC-48, S-88, PROVIDING PREFERENTIAL RIGHTS TO REGISTERED VOTERS OF QUEZON CITY TO BE EMPLOYED AND HIRED IN INFRASTRUCTURE CONSTRUCTIONS AND BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS IN QUEZON CITY, BY LIMITING SAID PREFERENTIAL RIGHTS TO REGISTERED VOTERS AND BONAFIDE RESIDENTS OF THE BARANGAY/S WHERE SUCH CONSTRUCTIONS OR BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS ARE LOCATED.

SECTION 1. Registered voters and bonafide residents of barangays in Quezon City shall have and enjoy the preferential rights to be employed or hired in construction projects and in business establishments located in their respective barangays except when such positions, which by their very nature are highly confidential, highly technical or requiring special skills in arts, science and technology.

The preferential rights requirement as herein envisioned shall be complied with if at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the total personnel needs of a certain establishment is recruited from the registered voters and bonafide residents of the barangay in which said establishment is conducting its business.
