AN ORDINANCE DECLARING JANUARY 6 OF EVERY YEAR AS "TANDANG SORA DAY" IN QUEZON CITY, IN MEMORY OF THE REVOLUTIONARY HEROINE, MELCHORAAGUINO.

WHEREAS, Melchora Aquino, popularly known as "Tandang Sora" and "Mother of the Philippine Revolution", was born to prosperous farmer parents Juan Aquino and Valentina de Aquino on January 6, 1812 in Barrio Banlat, Kalookan, Rizal (now Banlat, Quezon City);

WHEREAS, "Tandan Sora" had manifested extraordinary heroism during the Philippine Revolution by offering her modest nipa house in Banlat, Quezon City, to the sick and injured Katipuneros, at the expense of her own safety;

WHEREAS, the late heroime did not only offer her residence to the revolutionists but also extended assistance by feeding and nursing them;

WHEREAS, the Spanish Colonial Government had ordered her incarceration and deportation to Guam in 1896 because of her open support and sympathy to the cause of the Revolution;

WHEREAS, because of old age and deteriorating health, "Tandang Sora", after living for six (6) long years in exile, died on March 2, 1919, at the age of one hundred seven (107);

WHEREAS, the Philippine Historical Committee (PHC), now the National Historical Institute (NHI) in giving due recognition to the heroism of "Tandang Sora", installed a historical marker in Banlat, Quezon in 1958;
