ORDINANCE NO. SP-221, S-94

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A QUEZON CITY YOUTH BRIGADE FOR EVERY BARANGAY IN QUEZON CITY, DEFINING ITS POWERS AND FUNCTIONS, AND ALLOCATING THE AMOUNT OF TWO MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P2,500,000.00) OR SO MUCH THERE-OF, AS MAY BE NECESSARY, FROM THE SPECIAL PROJECT FUNDS OF THE OFFICE OF THE CITY MAYOR, FOR ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.
