A RESOLUTION URGING THE NATIONAL PARKS DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE TO ALLOW THE ROTARY INTERNATIONAL DISTRICT 3780 TO ERECT A PEACE MONUMENT AT THE QUEZON MEMORIAL CIRCLE.

WHEREAS, a project for peace was initiated to help promote peace in the world through the efforts of Rotary International, which was conceived and started at Wagga-Wagga, Koorringal, Australia, on February 23, 1993, and proclaiming Wagga-Wagga as a Rotary City of Peace by Mayor Alderman pat Brassil, as the first Rotary City of Peace in the world;

WHEREAS, several cities in the world helping to promote peace have followed suit like, Manila, Zamboanga, Davao, Cebu and Makati beside those cities in some parts of the world that have declared their cities as Peace cities;


WHEREAS, as an acknowledgement of awareness and a sign of unity with other cities in promoting peace, a Peace Monument Symbol must be displayed at the Quezon Memorial Circle, a significant place to spread the idea of peace and goodwill across our country and the whole world;


NOW, THEREFORE,
