RESOLUTION NO. SP- 5245, S-2011

A RESOLUTION URGING THE CITY MAYOR, HONORABLE HERBERT M. BAUTISTA TO CONSTRUCT A FOUR-STOREY BUILDING AT SAN FRANCISCO ELEMENTARY SCHOOL AND ALLOCATING THE NECESSARY FUNDS THEREFOR TO BE TAKEN FROM THE CITY TREASURY OR ANY AVAILABLE FUNDS.

WHEREAS, Article XIV of the 1987 Constitution, provides that: Section 1. The State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels, and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all; Section 2. The State shall (1) Establish, maintain, and support a complete, adequate, and integrated system of education relevant to the needs of the people and society; xxxxxxxxxx;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government has always adhered to the policy of promoting and providing quality education to its constituents;

WHEREAS, the right to education encompasses a comfortable and conducive place for teaching and learning;

WHEREAS, there has been an increase in the number of students desiring to obtain and acquire quality education from San Francisco Elementary School;

WHEREAS, San Francisco Elementary School lacks sufficient number of classrooms to cater to the needs of its present and future students;

WHEREAS, there has been an official request from San Francisco Elementary School, coursed through its principal, Mr. Gerry F. Isip, requesting for the construction of a four-storey building which will provide them with nineteen (19) new classrooms;

WHEREAS, a first endorsement from the School's Division Superintendent was forwarded to the Infracom Technical Working Group on Schools, which was assessed, evaluated and were found to be feasible for inclusion in the CY 2008 School Building Program of the Quezon City Local School Board;


WHEREAS, the construction of the new school building will provide convenience to the students as well as the teachers and ensure the effective delivery and access to quality education for the City's public elementary students;

WHEREAS, this additional school building shall also enable San Francisco Elementary School to admit more students without compromising the quality education that it provides.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby urge the City Mayor, Honorable Herbert M. Bautista to construct a four-storey building at San Francisco Elementary School, and allocating the necessary funds therefor, to be taken from the City Treasury or any available funds.
