*WHEREAS, the late Emilio G. Tamayo, in 1954 finished his primary education at the Malasiqui Elementary School, his secondary education at the Agno Valley College in 1958, and in 1965, he studied at the Mapua Institute of Technology in Manila taking up BS Architecture*

*WHEREAS, the late Emilio G. Tamayo, a loving family man, married Ophelia Abañio and their union begot seven children, namely Dino, Emil, Delfin, Ramon, Jose Noel, Ana Patricia and Miguel Angelo;*

*WHEREAS, the late Emilio G. Tamayo, is an Architect by profession, was elected Councilor of the First District for three consecutive terms from February 1988 to June 30, 1998, was considered as one of the most active public servants that the City can be proud of;*

*WHEREAS, the late Emilio G. Tamayo, as Chairman of the Committee on City Planning, Building and Zoning, sponsored the passage of the Quezon City Zoning Ordinance of 1992. He also initiated the long-overdue rezoning of Quezon City which served as the catalyst for progress;*

*WHEREAS, he also sponsored landmark ordinances such as, the creation of the People's Law Enforcement Board (PLEB), the Office for Senior Citizens Affairs (OSCA), and the Disabled Person Affairs Committee (DPAC);*

*WHEREAS, Quezon City, its officials and residents, mourns his passing and convey their condolences and heartfelt sympathies to his family, with heartfelt gratitude for his work and legacy as a true public servant.*
