RESOLUTION NO. SP- 5379, s-2011

A RESOLUTION URGING CONGRESS TO REVIEW THE PROVISIONS OF THE EXPANDED VALUE ADDED TAX (EVAT) TO EASE THE IMPACT OF THE CONTINUOUSLY RISING OIL PRICES ON THE ALREADY BURDENED CONSUMERS CAUSED BY HIGH PRICES OF COMMODITIES BY CUTTING OR REDUCING EVAT ON FUEL PRICES.


