A RESOLUTION RE-ESTABLISHING THE SISTER-CITY RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT AND THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF DAVAO AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE HONORABLE CITY MAYOR TO SIGN THE SISTER-CITY RENEWAL AGREEMENT.

WHEREAS, City Sisterhood and Town Twinning is a broad-based, officially approved, long-term partnership between local governments within the country and abroad. It is the highest form of inter-local government unit partnership, in a sense forging local government exchange and cooperation in the pursuit of mutually beneficial objectives along socio-cultural and economic aspects of development;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Council enacted Ordinance No. SP-2107, S-2011 "Establishing guidelines for sister city or twinning relations between Quezon City, other cities and municipalities" intended primarily to formalize the agreement between the City and other local and international government units;

WHEREAS, in 1994, then City Mayors Ismael A. Mathay, Jr. and Rodrigo R. Duterte have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding to establish a Sister-City Cooperation to promote and expand an effective and mutually beneficial cooperation in the development of both cities;

WHEREAS, the proposed reestablishment of sister-city relationship between these two great cities will further enhance their respective local governance towards socio-cultural, trade and economic development;




WHEREAS, both cities, in accordance with their prevailing laws, and regulations, establish a sister-city cooperation to promote and expand an effective and mutually beneficial cooperation in the development of both cities, within the limits of their financial, material and personnel capabilities in the following fields:

- a. Environment;
- b. Human Resources and Community Development;
- c. Science and Technology;
- d. Education and Sports;
- e. Tourism Development;
- f. Trade; and
- e. and Other fields of partnership.

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Quezon City Government to foster friendship, trade, understanding and cooperation.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to re-establish, as it does hereby re-establish the sister-city relationship between the Quezon City Government and the City Government of Davao and further authorizing the Honorable City Mayor to sign the Sister-City renewal agreement. x




