RESOLUTION NO. SP-9075, S-2022

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE ANNUAL INVESTMENT PLAN (AIP) OF THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT (QCG) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023 IN THE AMOUNT OF FORTY-THREE BILLION EIGHT HUNDRED TWO MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED NINE THOUSAND PESOS (PHP43,802,709,000.00) COVERING THE VARIOUS EXPENDITURES FOR THE OPERATION OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT AND APPROPRIATING THE NECESSARY FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE, SUBJECT TO EXISTING LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS, Section 115 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that “The Department of Budget and Management shall furnish the various local development councils, information on financial resources and budgetary allocations applicable to their respective jurisdictions to guide them in their planning functions”;

WHEREAS, Section 455 (b)(1)(vi) of the same Code states that “the City Mayor shall represent the City in all its business transactions and sign in its behalf all bonds, contracts, and obligations, and such other documents upon the authority of the Sangguniang Panlungsod or pursuant to law or ordinance”;

WHEREAS, the Annual Investment Plan (AIP) is a legal instrument by which a Local Government Unit (LGU) annually manages and financially support its Local Development Plan (LDP) and Local Development Investment Program (LDIP);



BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to adopt, as it does hereby adopt, the Annual Investment Plan (AIP) of the Quezon City Government (QCG) for Fiscal Year 2023 in the amount of Forty-Three Billion Eight Hundred Two Million Seven Hundred Nine Thousand Pesos (Php43,802,709,000.00) covering the various expenditures for the operation of the City Government and appropriating the necessary funds for the purpose, subject to existing laws, rules and regulations.
